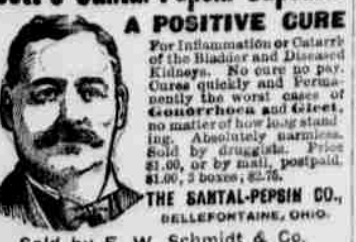

CUCUMBERS, CARROTS AND GREEN APPLES IN MARKET.

Raspberries and Strawberries Have Fallen in Price—Hide Market and Staples All at a Standstill, and Boston Wool Market is Uneventful.

About a week ago it was said that the strawberry market was a thing of the past, and it is in a general way, but there are still a few berries to be bought for 10 cents a box.

Cucumbers have also made their appearance and are selling at two for 5 cents, and they are selling rapidly at that. Carrots are another new thing on the list this week and are going at three bunches for a dime.

Green apples are also on the market at 3 cents a pound or \$1 a box. Raspberries have fallen a little during the week and can be bought now for 10 cents straight.

The Wheat Trade.

Portland, July 16.—The wheat market remains very inactive and there is nothing doing in the way of export. Several vessels are in port loading wheat and flour for foreign account, and some good size parcels have gone to California, since the beginning of this month.

Flour—This market shows but little change from that of a week ago, offers are received daily by cable, from different sections but prices quoted are not satisfactory to most millers, and the same is rejected. The demand from Japan has not as yet fallen off, and several good sized cargoes will be dispatched to that country this month, the steamer from Portland carrying over 40,000 barrels last Friday.

Barley—Market very dull and nothing doing, as new barley has not yet been harvested. Prices for old remains at \$20 per ton for feed.
