APPROPRIATION FOR WAR

VETERANS SHORT.

Already Over \$90,000 Paid Out and Many More Claims to Come in-Over 300 Claimants Yet to Hear From:

Salem Ore., July 18-The present allook is that the \$100,000 appropriated by the last legislature for the of Indian war veterans will lack \$50,000 of being sufficient. Acmorning by the attorney general to the secretary of state, those whose claims are not reached before the \$100,000 has been expended will be ompelled to wait until another legdature makes an appropriation ore their claims can be nuflited. This s a modification of the opinion reaal some time ago when the aftorcentral advised Mr. Dunbar that he should audit all claims presented, even though the appropriation had been exhausted.

The secretary of state has audited and paid claims to the annount of \$90,325.57. This leaves \$9,145.96 in the fund. There are on file claims ag-grogating \$12,180.50, so that it is apurent that those who have not yet dtheir claims in the office of the secretary of state will have to wait until 1905 or later before the secre-(ar) of state can act upon their The secretary will receive and file all claims presented, but w! audit any in excess of the amount the appropriation. Those not audit to reported to the next mo for such action as that body doom advisable

In the present instance it is clear that the Indian war veterate' claims were not incurred in parsuance of authority of law, for the claims were against Oregon Territory and the gen-eral government assumed all territorial debis.


