CLAIMED THAT THE KING IS REALLY A HOME RULER.

There Are Doubts About the Nature of His Reception Next Week at Dublin-Irish People Admire His Personality, But Are Not Satisfied With His Record,

Dublin, July 18 .- All Dublin, and in truth, all !reland, is on the qui vive in anticipation of the king's coming. Visitors are already pouring in, and it is estimated that the normal population of Dublin, about 265,000 will, by next Tuesday, have swollen to 1,000. 000. The star-spangled banner is very prominent among the flags covering the houses along the royal route.

Meanwhile there is much specula tion as to the exact nature of the welcome that awaits the royal visitor. There can be no doubt that Edward VII is personally popular in Ireland. Frank, open-hearted, generous and invariably considerate, courteous and kind, he is of the type of man that appeals to the Irish. Whatever be the foundation for the impression, it is generally believed this side of the is generally believed this side of the Irish sea that the king is friendly to Ireland, and that he would not object to a revision of the laws which would give the right to her people to govern themselves.

In other words, he is said to be a home-ruler, and when, added to this, it is believed that the land bill now in parliament is largely, if not mainly, his inspiration, and that to him is due the release of P. A. McHugh, M. P., from Sligo prison, there seems to be no doubt that the welcome accorded him will be typical of the warm. ed him will be typical of the warm-hearted bespitality of the Irish peo-

Spirit of the Alcofness.

But it is as a man and not as a king. Edward VII will be received As a man he represents a standard that the Irish people appreciate and admire; as a king he represents the constitution established by the nefarious Act of Union, which deempire. In these circumstances the nationalist civic bodies throughout freiand will, as a rule, hold aloof from the presentation of rulsome addresses or of any address, for that matter.

John Redmond, leader of the Irish arliamentary party, has connsoled the people to receive the king respect-fully, but in no instance to comprome ise the tenets of nationalism by the presentation of which would be sure to be interpreted in Eagle 1 as proof that the Irish are a contented and happy people. Mr. Redmond's advice to the nationalist councils has been accepted as going as far as courtesy demands and honesty permits on the occasion. The chairman of Irish policy in tendering that advice has invented no new policy. He has merely repeated the suggestions that Mr. Parnell gave the country for sas City. St. Joseph, Omaha and its guidance in 1885. No nationalist council will reject that advice save one that views with secret hostility the several of the national movement. and desires to wreck the work which the Irish party is engaged undersiming its authority and influ-ence. The suggestions give full play to the characteristic courtesy of the frish people towards strangers, warm-of as it may be here and there into comething more than courtesy among those who believe, on whatever evidence, that the king's personal views are triendly to a conciliation of Irish national sentiment and opinion.
