SPOKANE RESERVE

OVER ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND ACRES LIABLE.

Five Hundred Fifty-Five Indians Will First Receive Eighty Acres of Land Each-No Action Till After Allot-

Washington, July 20.- It is expect that under the contract recently sthorized the survey of the lands of the Spokane Indian reservation in Eastern Washington will be complet ed early in the summer of 1964, and as soon thereafter as possible allotments of 80 acres each will be made o every hodian man, woman and child properly on the reservation. The balance aside from a small area eserved for schools, grazing, be opened to exploration locathe mining laws, as provided in the ast Indian appropriation act

The Spokane reservation contains oproximately 152,000 acres, and acording to the last census, taken by the school authorities, the population is 555, of which number 271 are Low-er Spokanes, and 184 are Upper and Middle Spokunes. Each of these in lians will be entitled to so acres of agricultural land on the reservation which is equivalent to a total alloc-ment of about 44,400 acres. Allowing 5,000 acres for schools, grazing lamis and other pulse's purposes, there will in round numbers, be about 100,000 acres of the reservation to be opened presidential proclamation

It will be recalled that immediately after the passage of the Indian approprintion act in the first session of the past congress, a number of prospect ors, rushed onto the Spokane reser vation and attempted to acquire lands the mineral laws: after the act was signed. A subsequent resolution was passed annulling the opening feature of the law as applied to the Spokane reservation original act had been passed on the assumption that allotments had been made which was not true. 
