DEATHS EXCEED BIRTHS.

Auditor Honeycutt Makes His Quarterly Report of Vital Statistics to State Health Board.

Walla Walla, July 20.—According to Auditor Honeycutt's quarterly report of vital statistics for Walla Walla county, mailed out to the state health board today, the number of deaths to occur for the quarter ending June 30, exceeded the births by one. Of the former there were 54, and of births 53. April was the banner month for births, 20 being reported. May came next with 18 and June with 15. Of this number, 27 were males and 26 females.
