If Umatilla county rolls up a two-thirds crop this year, as all results so far indicate, it means that no fears need be entertained by farmers in the future. The conditions surrounding the present crop from the time it was seeded until it is being harvested, have been unusual, and will probably not be experienced again in years. The snowfall was so light that the young grain was not protected during the winter. The spring was so cold and unfavorable to growth that the crop did not get started off right and the dry weather of the months of April and May held it back until many farmers were in despair. After all this array of unusually severe conditions, a couple of refreshing showers and a sufficiency of sunshine have produced at least three and a half million bushels of wheat in the county. It is a test of strength that cannot be gainsaid. It is a trial of endurance that will probably not be imposed upon the county again in a generation. It proves that the abiding fertility of Umatilla county cannot be conquered even by a combination of the adverse elements.

One of the most refreshing facts disclosed by the annual school report of Superintendent Nowlin, is that the salaries paid male teachers in the county have increased from an average of \$40 per month in 1902 to \$52.50 per month in 1903, and the average for female teachers has increased from \$30 in 1902, to \$42.50 in 1903. The report shows 6,233 scholars in the county, an increase of 247 over last year. There are also 195 organized districts and 881 scholars shown not attending any school. Books numbering 4,882 are now to be found in school libraries, an increase of 355 over 1902. Umatilla county follows Multnomah in the educational records of the state and while the increase of salaries is magnificent, there is yet room for improvement.

There is a brisk demand for good teams in Portland to work on the Lewis and Clark fair site, and Canada is crying for Oregon horses. The horseman of the Inland Empire is now at the open door of the best demand for his stock, in the history of the West and he is evidently not able to meet it. The government, the building activity and the farmers of the North are all in the field for horses and are finding but few.

There is yet some hope for the circus gypsies. When Sells Brothers reached South Dakota last week, 200 of their employes deserted to go to work in the wheat harvest. This is something in their favor.
