FRUIT CROP PROMISES
TO BE ABOUT AVERAGE.

John Kline has gone over north of Pendleton to take in the coming harvest.

It was 100 above in the shade at 4:30 p. m. and 78 at 8:30 a. m. today. The hot weather is telling on everything. We had a nice rain last Sunday night and it is quite threatening at times, yet we need it very bad just now.

MILITIA ENCAMPMENT.

Oregon National Guard to Enjoy Nine Days' Outing.

An encampment of the Oregon National Guard has been authorized by Governor George Chamberlain, upon the recommendation of the military board. The encampment will be held between Thursday, September 3d, and Saturday, September 12, inclusive.

These days include the time to be spent by the companies of the guard in going to and from the camp. Under this arrangement the guard will be allowed at least nine days of actual encampment. This is a decided increase over last year, when but six days were spent in camp. The selection of a camp has not yet been made. General Gantenbain will take up this work at once, and incidentally will begin today to secure favorable railroad rates from the Oregon railroads.

FIFTY-SIX YEARS AGO.

Anniversary of the Arrival of the Mormons.

Salt Lake City, July 24.—This is a day that always fills the minds of the people of Utah with interesting reveries as it marks the anniversary of the day when in 1847, the Pioneers, after a march of great privation across the desert, reached the land that was destined to be their home. The day was observed in Salt Lake as a general holiday, stores and offices being closed and many of the places decorated with flags and bunting. In the Mormon meeting houses as has been the custom for years, special exercises in commemoration of the arrival of the Pioneers were held and addresses delivered by speakers of prominence.

To Launch Big Steamship.

Camden, N. J., July 24.—Arrangements have been completed at the yards of the New York Shipbuilding Company for the launching early in the coming week of the mammoth steamship *Manhattan*. The vessel is one of two being built for the Pacific Mail Steamship Company. She is 625 feet long, and is one of the largest craft ever built in this country. Her sister ship, the *Mongolia*, being built at the same yards, will be ready for launching in a few months.

On the grounds are bowling alleys, golf links, tennis courts and croquet sets; on the lakes, just back of the hotel, is a fleet of motor and rowboats, and on Shortwater Bay, just east of the lakes, is a gasoline launch for parties of fishermen, picnicers or others who prefer the warm, still-water bathing to the tumbling of the surf.

All trains stop at the railroad station in the hotel grounds, and no crowding into hotel omnibuses or walking in sand is necessary since the hotel ground is a perfect velvety lawn, where the guests are practically landed at the hotel door.

The Breakers Hotel is located at Breakers Station, a regular ticket office, where all trains stop. It is one and a half miles north of Long Beach Station.

In purchasing tickets see that they read to Breakers, Wash and have baggage checked through to that point.

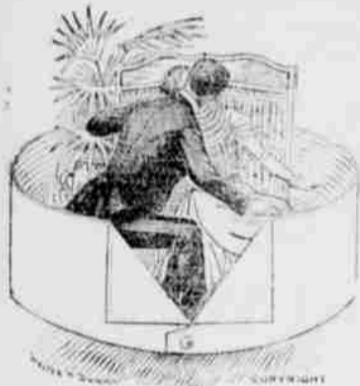
