MILITIA ENGAMPMENT.

Oregon National Guard to Enjoy Nine Days' Outing.

An encampment of the Oregon Naional Guard has been authorized by Governor George Chamberlain, the recommendation of the military board. The encampment will be held between Thursday, September 3d, and Saturday September 12, inclu-
