About \$1,400 Will Be Expended Upon the Structure-Work to Begin Very Soon-Both the Waiting Rooms Will Be Enlarged and Made More Convenient-Building Will Also Be Regainted

For some time the people who have had to travel over the O. R. & N. have been aware of the fact that the depot at this place was sadly in need of some changes for the convenience of the public, and it seems that the sidering the matter, and have drawn plans for an extensive remodeling of the lower floor and the changing of the upper floor.
