



TALKING OF OREGON

EDYTH TOZIER WEATHER-
RED ON ATLANTIC COAST.

Tells the Wondering Natives of Lewis and Clark Fair—Lays Before Them the Beautiful Story of the Oregon Country.

"Yes, I am from away out in Oregon, and it is so far West that it begins to be East; for we are in close touch with the Orient, the islands of the Pacific and, in fact, the world—a country unsurpassed in natural endowments, cultivated resources, vast opportunities and marvelous possibilities. Our climate is neither severe in winter, nor extreme in summer," says Edyth Tozier Weathered to an Atlantic City paper.

"You Easterners go yearly to Europe, rave over the grandeur of the scenery, leaving the impression that the Creator neglected Uncle Sam's great plantation when here, and far beyond the Rockies, we can present a panorama unsurpassed on the globe.

"In the great Northwest gigantic mountains of perpetual snow tower high into the blue heavens. Waterfalls leap hundreds of feet into lordly rivers and pass through gorgeous natural waterways to the sea. Our valleys are rich in fields of wheat and other grain, three to five thousand acres in one plot, and massive forests where trees stand two and three hundred feet, 10 to 12 feet in diameter, for a distance of 50 feet.

"In 1905 the Oregon country will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the expedition of Lewis and Clark, sent out by President Thomas Jefferson. Great and grand preparations are going on, all of which will be finished by May 1, 1905, and the world is invited to come and view the resources of America and the Orient.

"We also hope to have the International League of Press Clubs with us in June of that year, feeling sure that their entertainment will surpass all previous occasions."

LABOR CARNIVAL.

Central Labor Union at Seattle is Conducting One.

Seattle, Wash., July 27.—The carnival under the auspices of the Western Central Labor Union, for which preparations have been in progress for several months, opened today in a blaze of glory. The carnival is the most ambitious affair of the kind ever attempted in this section of the country. A large area centrally located has been set aside for carnival purposes and here are elaborate exhibits made by merchants and manufacturers, as well as by the labor organizations. In addition to these displays there are numerous features of entertainment in the way of athletic and vaudeville shows. Probably the most interesting features of the two weeks' program, however, will be the aquatic contests and the various parades and pageants.

Where to Stop at North Beach

The building has an ocean front of 100 feet, is 76 feet wide, four stories high, or 72 feet from the ground floor to the top of observatory.
