# ARE BADLY NEEDED

NEW BRICK BUSINESS  
HOUSES NEARLY DONE.

Rooms for Conduct of Business are at a Premium and the Matlock, Milarkey, Reusch and Darveau Buildings Will Not Fill the Demand.

The W. F. Matlock building on Court street, is on the way toward completion, all of the brick work having been finished and the carpenters having a good start on the woodwork of the interior. It will be but a short time until all of the work is done and the building is ready for the occupants.

The brick across the street being put up by Thomas Milarkey, is not so far along as the Matlock building, but is rapidly being finished. The masons are now steadily at work, all of the brick necessary having been procured, so that they have no reason for delay. This building will be ready inside of a month for the persons who are to take it.

The new brewery is also well along in the line of advancement and will be ready for the finishers in a short time. The brick work is practically done, and the carpenters are at work on the woodwork so that it is more a matter of finishing than of construction. It will be ready inside of a month.

These three bricks complete the list of business houses now under course of construction, with the exception of the sample room now building by George Darveau. This latter will be done in the course of a month, and then all of the new business houses will be ready for the demand. Store room is at a premium in the city, and no location can be secured by those wanting to start in a new line. It is hoped that the new places will alleviate this condition.
