COUSIN OF J. T. OGLE  
DROWNED IN KANSAS.

Great Abundance of Wild Huckleberries—Fencing Being Done in the Mountains—Fine Span of Work Horses Lost—Short Crop of Hay is All Harvested.

Ridge, July 25.—J. T. Ogle received a letter last week from a cousin in Kansas, stating that another of his cousins, Dr. Courtney, a prominent physician of Lebanon, was drowned about two weeks ago while swimming in a pond near that town. He leaves many friends as well as relatives to mourn his fate.

A large party of Ridge and Nye people were out on a huckleberry round-up this week. The results as yet are unknown, but are supposed to be a success, as an abundance of this fruit is to be found in places.

Leroy Wachter has just completed fencing his homestead in the mountains near here. He reports fine grass out in his locality and no grasshoppers to speak of.

### JOURNAL WAGON RETURNS.

Advertising Party Sent Out by Portland Paper Completes the Circuit and Goes Home.

The Portland Journal advertising and subscription wagon, which left Shanika in May for a tour of the Central Oregon counties, has made the circuit and will arrive in Portland about the last of this week. The venture was a novelty in the way of hunting business for a newspaper, but proved to be highly successful.

A large amount of data regarding Oregon history, industry and general news was collected and will be used in a special edition this fall. The wagon made every hamlet in the interior of the state, and visited every stock ranch of any note, beside making many "dry" camps in the desert where there were no ranches to greet the eyes of the travelers.

In all the wagon traveled about 2,000 miles and perhaps made the most complete tour of the interior country, ever made by any one wagon on a continuous journey, in the state.

The same party will make a tour of the Southern Oregon mining and farming counties, immediately on their arrival at Portland. The venture has been so successful, in the way of advertising the state and helping the interior country in touch with the metropolis, that it may be kept on the road continuously.

Many stories are told of the interest this novel sight excited in the far interior. The wagon was equipped with a canvas cover bearing the legend, "Oregon Daily Journal," followed by the prices of the paper, and it looked strangely out of place among the cattle camps of the Oregon desert. It is safe to say that photographs were taken of places and scenes that will add greatly to the very history of the state, in time.

### IOWA BANKERS.

State Association is Met Today—Illinois Bankers Meet With Them.

Davenport, Iowa, July 28.—The seventeenth annual meeting of the Iowa State Bankers' Association opened this morning with a good attendance. Mayor Waldo Beck welcomed the bankers on behalf of the city, and the response was by Ackley Hubbard, of Spencer. J. M. Dinwiddie, of Cedar Rapids, secretary of the association, then gave his annual report, showing a year of great activity and growth. The treasurer's report was read by F. Y. Locke, of Shiley.

This afternoon a joint session was held with the Illinois Bankers' Association, whose annual convention is being held in Rock Island. Addresses were delivered on financial and currency reform by Congressman C. M. Fowler, of New Jersey, and on the conservatism of prosperity, by Governor Cummings, of Iowa. At tomorrow's session there will be more addresses, reports of the committees, discussion of resolutions and election and installation of officers.

### TEACHERS OF TENNESSEE.

Educators of Every Degree Are in Session at Montezuma.

Montezuma, Tenn., July 28.—All branches of education, from the crossroads school to the university, are well represented among the scores of teachers assembled here for the thirty-eighth annual meeting of the Tennessee State Teachers' Association. At a preliminary meeting this afternoon the usual committees were appointed and the final details of the convention program completed. The regular business sessions will commence tomorrow morning and continue through Thursday.

The officers in charge of the convention are: President S. E. Hill, Knoxville; vice-president, A. R. Thomas, Paris; second vice-president, J. H. Stone, Nashville; third vice-president, Miss Kate Rogers, Clarksville; secretary and treasurer, S. A. Myrdetta, Jackson.

### Want Interchangeable Mileage.

Mashburn Island, Me., July 28.—The International Federation of Commercial Travelers' organizations began its annual meeting here today and will remain in session until Saturday. Nearly 100 delegates are present, representing organizations with a combined membership of 150,000. The federation aims to better the welfare and conditions of work of the commercial travelers of the country and among other things is concerning itself just now in a prolonged agitation for an interchangeable mileage ticket of 2,000 miles.

### Iowa Firemen's Tournament.

Sioux City, Iowa, July 28.—The Iowa State Firemen's Association began its annual meeting and tournament here today. Firemen accompanied by bands and citizens poured in on every train. The city is decorated and numerous immense arches welcome the fire-fighters. Tomorrow morning a grand parade at all the firemen present will take place. In the afternoon the book and ladder and hose races will be held at the Interstate fair grounds.
