General Conditions and Splendid Crops in Nearly Every Section Get the Credit-North, South, East and West All Share in the Prospects.

Chicago, Ill., July 28.-In the opinion of well-posted traffic officials all lines of business could not be in a much more healthy condition. ally, attention is concentrated upon western territory, particularly that in which the great erop-growing areas which serve as a guide for future business operations. Careful investiga-tion has falled to disclose anything in the prospective conditions which would justary anxiety in New York's financial district. In the Northwest railroad men are equally optimistic and fully as confident that not only is the crop outlook encouraging, but the indications point to a greater volume of traffic for the railroads than was assured one year ago.

In the southwest traffic conditions are rapidly becoming such that offi-cials say they have difficulty in handling it promptly and are looking for a car shortage earlier than usual, alpared for tonnage than ever before. 
