NOTES FROM ECHO

SCHOOL BONDS CARRIED BY VOTE OF FOUR TO ONE.

Proposition to Vote Bonds for a New School Building Will Be Submitted—Omar Campbell Will Build a Livery Stable—New Bridge Will Be Built at Foster—J. H. Koontz Will Build a Residence.

Echo, Ore., July 29.—Alex Malcolm left yesterday to spend a week or 10 days in the mountains for rest and recuperation.

Work on the foundation for the cannery is being pushed with a vim and all the available carpenters in town are pressed into service.

S. H. Thompson, the barber, who has been spending some months at Hilgard for his health, returned home this morning.

The Echo Land & Lumber Co. recently sold to Frank Spiko, the road supervisor, a carload of lumber for the bridge at Foster and Mr. Beath now has a force of carpenters repairing the bridge. A lot of repairs will also be made to the bridge at Nolan in a short time.

Arthur Hammer and Chas. Shockey today commence the repair and construction of the entire system of the Butter Creek Telephone Company.

B. Teel and family of The Dalles, arrived a few days ago and have taken up their residence here.

Mrs. J. A. Greene left this morning for Pendleton to take charge of the Strabon Rooming house, which she recently purchased of Mrs. H. E. Cooper and Miss Kennedy takes her place as proprietress of the Arlington hotel here.

New Livery Stable. Omar Campbell, better known as "Curley," on next Monday will commence the erection of a livery barn at this place. The building is to be 200 feet long and 50 feet wide. This will give Echo two first-class livery barns and with two hotels, it begins to look like the boom is fairly on.

New Six-Room Cottage. J. H. Koontz will in a short time, commence the erection of a six-room cottage, with stone foundation and brick collar, the building to be occupied by the pastor of the M. E. church.

School Bonds are Voted. At the meeting yesterday to determine the question as to bonding the district for the purpose of enlarging the building and creating additional grades the vote stood 29 for bonds to 7 against bonds.

It is now proposed to call another meeting at once for the purpose of voting additional bonds with the view to building a new building entirely. An offer of \$400 has been made for the old building, and with an additional bond issue of \$1,500 a very creditable four-room building can be made and equipped. There is but little question but that such a building will be needed in a short time and it is hoped that this new proposition will carry. A few of those who opposed a bond issue at first have expressed themselves as favorable to the new idea.

Three Wagon Loads of Presents. President Roosevelt was the recipient of over three wagon loads of presents of all kinds during his Western trip, and these have been disposed of in the White House to suit the tastes and desires of the president and his family. The heaviest and bulkiest of the present was an immense chair made of elk horns. A big elk in the park at Tacoma, Wash., has annually shed his horns. These have been preserved, and it was from them that the chair for the president was made. The chair is so heavy that several men are required to lift and move it.
