GENERAL NEWS.

James J. Hill's personal property assessment at St. Paul has been raised from \$138,000 to \$200,000.

Reginald Vanderbilt recently paid \$8,000 in customs duties on the contents of 40 trunks from Europe.

A recent ruling of the classification board greatly reduces the duty on Bowie knives and horse pistols.

Blanch Walsh, the actress, has secured a divorce from Alfred Hickman. They were wedded in 1896.

The \$250,000 mansion at Trenton, N. J., built by Frank A. Magowan, will be sold at auction by creditors. Magowan is broke.

The Mexican government will be officially represented at the National Irrigation Congress at Ogden, Utah, by Colonel Don Ignacio.

An ancient boundary dispute between Brazil and Bolivia has been settled, by which Brazil secures territory but pays a round price for it.

The five largest refrigerator car lines in the United States have merged under the name of the National Car Line, with a capital of \$1,000,000.

As the result of a recent uprising of natives in the interior of Sumatra, 300 were killed in battle by the Dutch soldiery. Sumatra belongs to Holland.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

The Portland police force has just been increased by the addition of 10 men.

Forty miles of cement walks have been laid in Portland in the past seven months.

John Kirkpatrick, of Blackfoot, Idaho, was found dead in a hayfield Wednesday, where he had expired in an epileptic fit.

Fred J. Norton, who has tended bar in Astoria for the past 25 years, committed suicide Wednesday, by taking an overdose of morphine.

Guy Rogers, a noted Northwest jockey, of Seattle, was killed at that place Wednesday, by his horse falling upon him, in the five furlong race.

A misunderstanding in regard to the contract, will probably result in Moran Brothers, of Seattle, refusing to build the Portland fireboat. It will probably go to San Francisco.

The 25 bridges of Portland are all in need of extensive repairs, and the city authorities are making efforts to put them in good condition for the increased traffic of the summer of 1905.

James Laidlaw & Company, of Portland, have been awarded the contract of transporting 2,600,000 feet of lumber from Portland to Manila for the government, at \$8.95 per thousand.

Bob Meeks, one of the "Hole in the Wall" gang of robbers, confined in the Idaho insane asylum, escaped Wednesday, and is still at large. Meeks was in the Boise penitentiary and became insane, and was transferred to the asylum recently. It is now thought his ruse was to play insanity for the purpose of making his escape.

H. C. Curtis has returned from his home in Crook county, where he has been for some time. He reports the crops down there to be as good as any wheat he ever saw anywhere. He said the wheat on Mr. Sias' place was as fine a wheat as he ever saw. Mr. Sias and Mr. Curtis' homesteads join.

Mrs. Sam Booher and son came home from the Bingham Springs and returned Saturday afternoon. They will remain at the springs until the first of September.

Wheat From Thirty to Fifty Bushels.

The report of the crops already thrashed in this vicinity made an average of from 30 to over 50 bushels to the acre, some making 70 and some making over 50, and all being classed as No. 1 wheat, so far.

Wheat in the Helix locality is yielding 30 to 35 bushels to the acre.
