FEDERAL VETERANS

GRAND ARMY REPUBLIC NOW AT SAN FRANCISCO.

Ten Thousand Visitors Are Now in the City and More Coming—Gen. Black Will Not Have a Walkaway for Commander-in-Chief—Expect to Have Over 20,000 Old Soldiers in Parade.

San Francisco, Cal., Aug. 15.—Visitors are pouring into San Francisco by hundreds preliminary to the opening of the national encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic and the annual meetings of the several affiliated organizations.

The decorations may have been richer in triumphal arches and other designs at one or two other encampments, but at none was a city more profusely or generally decorated with American flags than is San Francisco today.

The work of the committee in the matter of illumination will attract much attention. The most imposing feature of the elaborate general design has been constructed at the intersection of Market and Kearny streets.

Who Will Be Commander? Among the veterans already on the field warm discussion is heard regarding the contest for commander-in-chief.

General Young, who succeeded to the command of the army on the retirement of General Miles one week ago, relinquishes the position and becomes first chief of the general staff.

General Young will retire for age next January, and will be succeeded as chief of staff by Major General Adna R. Chaffee.

to the business of the encampment and the entertainment of the veterans and their friends. One of the most distinctive features will be the big parade. In the ranks will be all the veterans' association in convention here, the Grand Army of the Republic, the Associated Veterans of the Mexican war, Spanish-American war veterans, National Association of Civil War Musicians, Sons of War Veterans and all kindred auxiliary societies of the grand army.

This parade will take place Tuesday. It will form at Union Square and march through the principal streets of the city.

On the following day there will be a procession of veterans alone. In the parade will march 45 departments of the grand army in the order of seniority. General Edward S. Salomon, chairman of the parade committee, is assured there will be between 20,000 and 25,000 veterans in line.

The committee on entertainment today completed the final details of the elaborate program of amusements. The main events will occur in the Mechanics' Pavilion. Tuesday there will be a public reception there, and a feast of baked beans, hard tack and coffee, with California dainties added, will be served.

During the week the fourth annual national encampment and reunion of the association of Spanish-American war veterans will be held. This convention will have the special object of uniting the various organizations of veterans of the late war now struggling for supremacy.

In the general arrangements the various women's auxiliaries have not been overlooked and special preparations have been made for their entertainment. During the week the Women's Relief Corps, the Ladies of the G. A. R., the society of war nurses and the other affiliated bodies will hold their reunions.
