EXTENSIVE SALES OF FINE BEEF CATTLE.

### G. A. R. PARADE.

Not Over 15,000 Union Veterans in Line Today.

San Francisco, Cal., Aug. 19.—Smaller, year by year, are the turn-outs of the G. A. R., not more than 15,000 veterans being in line in their grand parade today. Notwithstanding the fact that the number marching was smaller than heretofore, the large number of musical organizations and drum corps made the procession interesting. The parade started at 10 o'clock a. m., being concluded before 2 p. m., the line of march being shortened because of the age and infirmities of many of the marchers. From every fence post, porch, window and roof of every building along the march people looked down upon the long line of bobbing blue and to these spectators the veterans sent back cheers and hand waves of greeting. The entire route of the procession was tastefully decorated with flags and bunting.

Naturally, California and the neighboring states turned out the largest representation. Second in point was Ohio, followed by Pennsylvania, Michigan, New York, Indiana, Illinois, Minnesota and Missouri. Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico were also conspicuous in the line. Occupying places of honor on the reviewing stand were General Miles, Governor Pardee, Mayor Schultz, General Shafter, General Bulkin of Connecticut, and General John C. Black of Illinois.

### VIRGINIA FIREMEN.

State Association is in Session at Danville.

Danville, Va., Aug. 19.—The streets of Danville are gay with flags and bunting today in honor of the members of the Virginia State Firemen's Association, whose seventeenth annual convention and tournament is in progress. The forenoon was devoted to the reception of the visitors who arrived in large numbers from every quarter of the state.

This afternoon the first session was held, at which greetings were delivered by Mayor Harry Wooding and Chief Reid of the Danville fire department. The discussion of topics relating to methods of fire prevention and fire fighting will commence this evening and will be continued at subsequent sessions of the convention. The spectacular features of the tournament program will begin with a grand parade tomorrow morning. Other interesting features will include horse races and hook and ladder drills for which a large number of prizes are offered.

The tournament will continue for three days and from present indications will be the most successful ever held under the auspices of the association.

### POISONED ICE CREAM.

Fifty People Suffer From Effects of Embalming Fluid in Milk.

Colorado Springs, Col., Aug. 19.—Over 50 people, the majority of whom are tourists in this city and Manitou from all parts of the country, have been poisoned from eating ice cream sold by local dealers from a consignment of cream received Sunday morning from one of the largest creameries and dairy companies in the state situated near Denver.

An analysis by health officers reveals the fact that the cream was charged with formaldehyde, better known as embalming fluid, to keep it from spoiling. No deaths have resulted, although several of the cases are critical. The name of the company having the cream has not been made public. Health officers of this city state that arrests will be made at once. The case promises to be sensational.

### FUNERAL DIRECTORS.
