

WEALTH IN DREAMS

MORMON TELLS HOW FA-MOS MINE WAS LOCATED.

A "Vision" Revealed the Spot Where One of the Richest Quartz Veins in the West Was Hidden-Gentiles Chaffed, But the Mormons Won.

In 1890, 12 years ago "Uncle" Jesse had a little ranch near Black Rock, in Beaver county, Utah. Being of the Mormon faith and strong in that belief, he placed great de pendence upon "revelations."

One night he had a "vision," as he formed it, and saw the side of a mountain, rugged and steep with a edge cropping out on its surface. The limness of the dream he saw the town of Eureka, and east of that mining camp he knew his mountain was located. A voice in the vision, so he states, told him to tunnel into the mountain side and he would discover

So strong was the impression left WASHINGTON & Treasures untold with him upon awakening that he started to find the place he saw in his dream. He had never done any mining, and knew nothing about how it was done except by observation. He found the spot shown to him in
