NORTHWEST CROPS

IDAHO AND WASHINGTON
SHOW GOOD RETURNS.

Weather Favorable in Both States—
Fruit Crop Good—Second Alfalfa
Crop Short in Idaho—Washington
Wheat Above First Expectations.

The weekly crop report for Wash-
ington and Idaho indicate that both
of Oregon's neighbor states are en-
joying favorable harvest weather and
good crops. The following excerpts
from the reports show general condi-
tions. The Washington report says:

"In the western section the week
was mostly cloudy and cool, with a
light rain on the 13th, and a sprinkle
on the 15th, 16th and 17th. While
the rain was very beneficial to root
crops and gardens, it was quite insuffi-
cient as much more is greatly needed,
for pastures are becoming short in
all sections.

"This has been an ideal week for
the harvesters and thrashers in the
eastern section, where it has been
clear, warm and dry. Harvesting of
winter wheat is about finished, ex-
cept in Stevens and Whitman coun-
ties. Threshing is now in full pro-
gress and grain is being hauled to the
warehouses. There will be a fair
average yield, the quality is fine, ex-
cept in a few localities, where some
mud is reported.

"In Spokane county oats and barley
will be good crops; sugar beets and
all root crops are looking fine. Oats
in the Sound country are reported
heavy and lodged in some places. Hop
spraying is finished and the yield will
be very good."

Idaho Crop Report.

The Idaho weekly crop bulletin
says in part:

"Correspondents in eastern coun-
ties report grain ripening very rapidly
under the influence of hot, dry
weather, and harvest is becoming
general. In other sections harvest is
approaching completion. The yield
of grain is expected to equal the av-
erage, as a whole, and the quality is
generally good; dry farm grain in
some localities is better than was ex-
pected.

"Harvest of second crop alfalfa is
extending into the more elevated dis-
tricts in the eastern portion of the
state. Except where there has been a
scarcity of water, the yield is good.
Ranges continue to fall, causing stock
to suffer in limited localities.

"Sugar beets are in good condition.
With few exceptions potatoes are
yielding well. The average of melons
is somewhat reduced, but the yield is
good, and the quality is excellent.
Shipping of apples has been begun,
and other fruits will soon be ready
for shipment. The weather has been
especially favorable for rapid devel-
opment of fruit."

GERMAN WAR VETERANS.

Those Who Fought for the Govern-
ment in 1861-65.

Terre Haute, Ind., Aug. 22.—The
streets of Terre Haute are gayly
garbed in the intertwined colors of
Germany and the United States in
honor of the members of the Kreis-
verein, or society of German war
veterans, whose annual national en-
campment will be in progress here
during the next four days. The soci-
ety has a large membership in Wis-
consin, Ohio, Indiana, Pennsylvania
and numerous other states, and rail-
road officials estimate that fully 10-
000 visitors will be here by nightfall.
Today was given over entirely to
the reception of the delegates. Tomor-
row forenoon there will be a mon-
ster parade, followed by an outdoor
demonstration and speech-making at
the fair grounds. The German resi-
dents of Terre Haute and vicinity
have made elaborate plans for the en-
tertainment of the members of the so-
ciety during their four days' stay in
the city.
