FORESTRY EXPERTS

EVERY PHASE OF THE WOODLAND QUESTION.

Tree Planting and Preservation and Forest Reserves Being Discussed at Minneapolis, Minnesota, Today—Government and Other Experts Are Attending.

Minneapolis, Minn., Aug. 25.—With Secretary of Agriculture Wilson presiding, and an attendance both large and representative, the American Forestry Association began its special summer meeting this morning in the rooms of the Commercial Club of this city. Two interesting sessions were held during the day at which papers were presented as follows: "Progress of Forestry in Michigan," Edwin A. Wilkey, Michigan forestry commissioner; "State Parks and Their Relation to Forestry," W. B. Douglass, attorney general of Minnesota; "Forestry Courses in Agricultural Colleges," Prof. S. B. Green, Minnesota state school of agriculture; "The Planting on Minnesota Prairies," G. L. Clothier, division of forest extension, Washington, D. C.; "Taxation Its Effects on Private Forestry," Prof. E. L. Bruncken, Wisconsin; "Financial Results at Biltmore," Dr. C. Alvin Schoenck, forester of the Vanderbilt estate, North Carolina; "Government Aid to Private Forestry," Overton W. Price, division of forest measurements, Washington, D. C.; "The Effect of the Calpewna Forest Reserve on the Locality," Herman H. Chapman, Grand Rapids, Minnesota.

The present meeting of the association will continue through tomorrow, closing in the evening with a public address by Secretary Wilson. Great significance is attached to this meeting in connection with the recent establishment of a national forest reserve at the headwaters of the Mississippi, with a stand of pine timber amounting to over 1,000,000,000 feet, part of which is to be cut this winter under the direction of the bureau of forestry, with a view to re-producing the pine.

This most important and extensive of all experiments so far attempted in American forestry will be set forth by members of the bureau for discussion by the association. The problems of reproduction, fire protection, and modified methods of logging, which will in the immediate future be tested on this reservation under the most favorable conditions ever secured for forestry work will be exhaustively discussed at the meeting.

SEPARATE CONVENTIONS.

Little Prospect of Nebraska Anti-Republicans Getting Together. Lincoln, Neb., Aug. 25.—For the first time in six years Nebraska democrats and populists are today holding their state conventions in different towns, the democrats at Columbus and the populists at Grand Island. Former Governor Poynter and several other populist leaders have recently declared in favor of breaking with the democrats altogether, but the majority sentiment is somewhat averse to this and something of a compromise arrangement has been effected. Though meeting separately the two conventions will unite on a renomination of Judge J. J. Sullivan for the supreme court bench, though separate candidates may be named for regents of the state university, the minor places on the state ticket to be voted for this fall. The Kansas City and Omaha platforms will be reaffirmed.

Legal Lights in Hot Springs.

Hot Springs, Va., Aug. 25.—The members of the American Bar Association began to arrive here today to attend the annual meeting of the association. The secretary of the association, John Hinkley, of Baltimore, was one of the first of the members to appear, that he might perfect arrangements. President Francis Rawle of Philadelphia will call the association to order at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning and his presidential address will be the chief feature of the opening session.

Carolina Sunday Schools.

Greenville, S. C., Aug. 25.—Many delegates and visitors representing nearly all parts of the state are here for the twenty-sixth annual convention of the South Carolina Sunday School Association, which will be in session during the next two days. The program calls for addresses by several speakers and Sunday school workers of note. The sessions are being held in the Washington street Presbyterian church.

Hanged at Media.

Media, Pa., Aug. 25.—Robert Kilpatrick was hanged in the county jail here shortly before noon today by Sheriff Howard, and in the presence of a small group of official witnesses. Kilpatrick's crime was the murder of his housekeeper, Elizabeth Bearmore. He was the first white man to be hanged in this county in 60 years.

George Bryant, a respected pioneer of Eugene, died Monday of congestion of the brain. He crossed the plains in 1854, to Lane county.
