support a permanent population. "Irrigated land in California produces annually a product greater in value than all the products of the mines of the golden state. The mines became worked out, but the land increased in productiveness. In the irrigated section, as the years went by, good roads were built, school houses sprung up and towns of a permanent character were es-tablished. On the other hand, the population of the mining camps was floating, when the ore played out the towns died. Spokane can accomplish in its territory identically the same result in a similar period.
