## NOTES FROM ECHO

THE LATE RAINS HAVE BEEN OF GREAT BENEFIT.

The River Flow Has Started and the Stockmen Are Rejoiced—Prospect of Government Irrigation Experiment Work is Accelerating the Real Estate Business—Government Officials Are in the Neighborhood.

Echo, Ore., Aug. 29.—Congressman-Elect J. N. Williamson, Congressman Malcolm A. Moody, Chief Hydrographer W. A. Newell, Engineer Brooks of New York, and Engineer John T. Whistler came in yesterday to look over the government irrigation enterprise at this place. They spent the day in gathering data concerning the various resources of this part of the country and in conversation with prominent irrigationists, and today drove out over the proposed line of ditch which was run out some months ago by Engineer James G. Camp.

Mr. Whistler has a force of surveyors in the field working on the reservoir sites.

It is the opinion of Congressman Moody that the completion of the enterprise depends wholly upon the feasibility of the proposition, which can be ascertained only by a complete investigation.

The nearness to market, quality of soil, immense amount of land and lay of the country are very much in favor of the enterprise.

These facts are causing some flurry in real estate here, and there is considerable inquiry for property in the village.

Quite a number of cabins are being built by those who recently fled homesteads, and the better becomes more prevalent even among those who had no faith that something will ultimately be done to reclaim this vast tract.

This enterprise, if found feasible and developed, would certainly be a great boon to this part of the country in particular, and to the state in general, and therefore should have the hearty endorsement and support of every one who is interested in building up the State of Oregon.

The delightful showers of a few days ago have cooled the atmosphere, besides starting the flow of the river and thereby providing water for the late crops of alfalfa. This means a greatly increased amount of feed and stockmen are very much encouraged.

### SURVEYING SHEEP RANGE.

Land Leased From E. O. L. Co., by Isaacs & Gwinn, Being Staked Off.

W. W. Caviness, of Malheur county, is surveying and locating for Isaacs & Gwinn, the stock range leased by them from the Eastern Oregon Land Company, measuring 21 miles in length, and 17 miles in width in the widest place. He has already surveyed the land from the head of Burnt river taking in the little Malheur, and extending all around Summit Prairie and Crane Prairie to the western side of Logan valley, and on the upper end thereof. Mr. Caviness has surveyed, off and on, for three years, locating watering places and springs for that firm. Mr. Caviness and wife were at the springs on Sunday and in Prairie City on Monday, and from here he returned to his camp at or near Summit Prairie to continue his survey. Isaacs & Gwinn are controlling an immense area of range, and are running about 30,000 head of sheep.—Prairie City Miner.

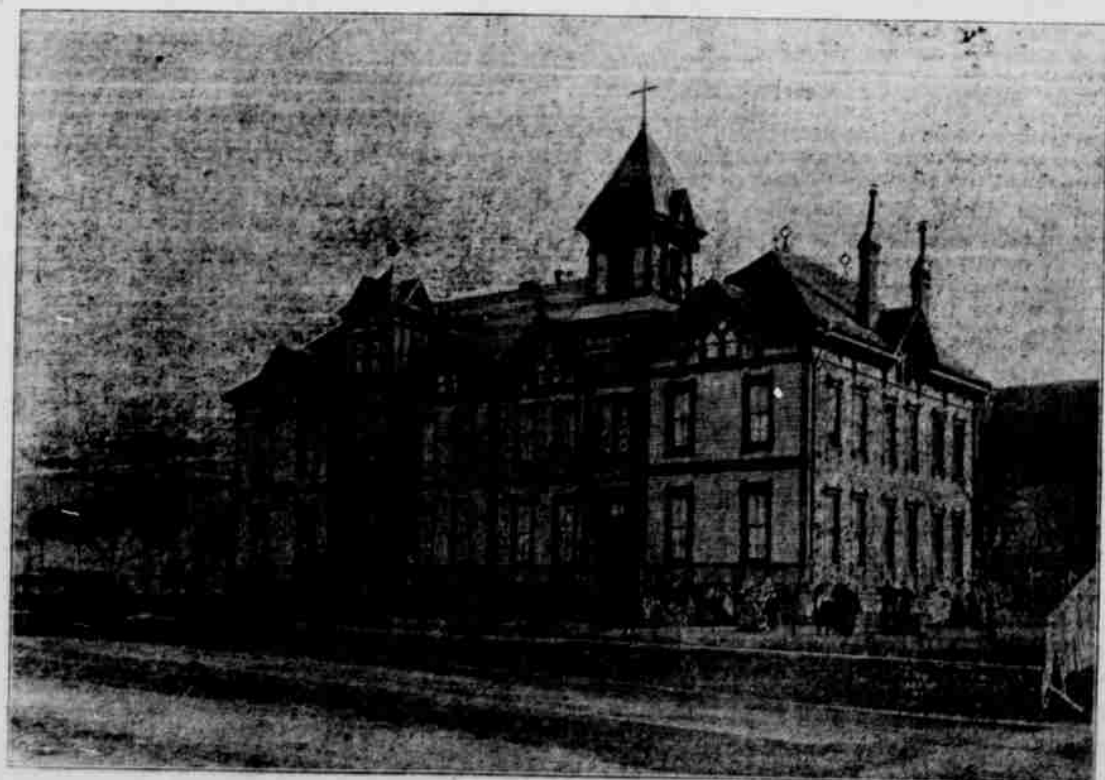
