The plans of this exhibit are bein made by a special committee appoint ed by the congress, which has give scientific attention to the work, unde the able direction of State Enginee Doremus of Utah.

This model farm is laid but on lan belonging to a state institution where about 20 acres are used for the purpose of this illustration. Method of taking water from the river, cana and laterals will be shown in a con act territory.

Modern devices for measuring an apportioning water will be shown, a well as the different methods of trr gation, by furrows, flood or check Losses in transporting water will be measured. This usage of the water will be practically demonstrated with various kinds of growing crops, in cluding grains and vegetables, has
