

FIRST SESSION NEXT MONDAY AT DEADWOOD.

All the Mineral Producing Regions of the United States Will Be Represented-Proposition to Have the In dustry Represented in the Cabine -A Portland Man is on the Executive Committee.

Deadwood, S. D., Sept. 5.—Delegates are already arriving in large num-bers for the meeting of the American Mining Congress, which is to begin its sessions here next Monday and continue through the week. Indications point to a large attendance from Colorado, California, Arizona, Alabama, Tennessee, Illinois, Missou-ri, Iowa, Indiana, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Montana, Idaho and num-erous other states. Judging from the preparations made and the large num-ber of early arrivals the session will be a memorable one. It is the first time that the suppression of the session will be a memorable one. It is the first time that the congress has been hon-ored by the official recognition of the president of the United States, who is to be represented by Leslie M. Shaw, secretary of the treasury.

The session is to last six cays, and the delegates and their friends, also,

will enjoy several outings that have been arranged for them. The speakers include such men as Dr. J. D. Hol-mes, E. W. Parker and George E. Roberts, of Washington, D. C.: Frank-Hn H. Carpenter, of Denver, and Representative C. E. Van Duzer, of Ne vada. Mr. Shaw will speak on "The Mining industry and Its Relation to American Finances." Hence there is no doubt that the technical part of the program will be interesting. Just what particular question will engage the uppermost attention of the con gress at this session will not be It is very probable, however, that the all-absorbing topic will have to

do with securing for the mining industry of the United States repre-sentation in the cabinet of the presi-dent. The fact that Secretary Shaw will attend the congress will no doubt accentuate, the discussion of this question, which for the past year has been agitated by members of the con-gress above all other matters. Whether the extra-lateral right issue will be taken up again as it was at Butte last year remains to be seen.

The coming session will mark the sixth annual meeting of this organiz ation. The congress has been in ex-istence nearly 10 years, though at its beginning meetings were held at ir-regular intervals. Last year the con-vention was held at Butte, and it was voted a big success by all who at-tended. This was due in a measure to the fact that the session was held at a real live mining camp, which added considerable interest to the deliberations of the body.

The officers of the congress who were elected last year are: President, J. H. Richards, Boise, Idaho; first vice-president, S. Russell, Deadwood, S. D.; second vice-president, E. R. Buckley, Rolla, Mo.; third vice-president, Thomas Ewing, Los Angeles, These, with Irwin Mahon, secretary, of Carlisle, Pa. Charles W. Goodale, of Butte, Colonel John T. Grayson, of Portland, Ore, W. L. Kendall, of Cleveland, and L. K. Armstrong, of Spokane, constitute the executive committee. The officers of the congress who
