ALBA NEWS NOTES

MANY FAT CATTLE YET REMAIN TO BE SOLD.

Third Drove From Born & Lazinka's This Season—Wild Hay Short, But Other Crops Make Up Usual Tonnage—Cattle Increasing in Mountain District.

Ukiah, Or., Sept. 8.—Within a half day's ride of this place are at least 500 head of choice beef steers, belonging to different settlers, who are waiting the coming of buyers into this district.

Already this season, Ukiah, Alba and Camas Prairie have furnished over 1,000 head of fat steers to the Portland and Sound markets, and probably that many more will be driven out yet this fall.

The range has been exceptionally good this year and the stock has all been in fine condition.

The wild hay crop in the Alba and Ukiah country was light, in some places, but the grain hay crops are heavy enough to make the total tonnage about the same, and the number of stock held over will be about the same as usual.

Among the stockmen who have not sold any fat cattle yet this year, are the following: Robert More, Charles Kimble, Ralph Clark, Frank Elbert, James Huston, Chide Helmie, Charles McComber and D. E. Combs.

The third drove which has been sent out this year from the farm of Jacob Born, left here on September 5, for Pendleton, from where they will be shipped to Seattle. There were 126 head in the drove, 45 of them belonging to Born & Lazinka, and the remainder belonging to other settlers in this vicinity.

The fall range is excellent and stock will gain in flesh greatly before the rough weather drives them from the mountains.

This district has sent out the largest amount of beef this year that has ever been sold any year since the settlement of Umatilla county, and as more hay land is brought into cultivation the number of stock supported in this locality will rapidly increase.

ANOTHER TRUSTY ESCAPES.

D. E. Shepherd, With Two More Years to Serve at Walla Walla, Walks Out of Town.

Walla Walla, Sept. 8.—D. E. Shepherd, a trusty in the penitentiary, with two more years of a four-year sentence, for horse stealing in Walla Walla county, to serve, took advantage of the confidence placed in him, and yesterday morning escaped from the city.

Shepherd is 65 years of age and had been a trusty for some time, on account of his age. He was sent up for horse stealing, two years ago from Walla Walla county, and it is thought he will suicide before being taken, as he has made several remarks lately, leading to the belief that he had suicidal intentions.

TRUSTY GRAFF CAPTURED.

Guards of the Walla Walla Penitentiary Give Chase for Thirteen Days.

Walla Walla, Sept. 8.—Graff, the trusty who escaped from the penitentiary, 13 days ago, was captured yesterday at Elgin by guards who have been on his trail ever since he took leave.

The prison guards came into Elgin from different directions, both of them having found a trail of their man leading toward the city. Graff was located with a sheepman near town, and by a ruse, was induced by the herder to leave his gun for a time, to go after some sheep that were straying from the main herd, and when he returned, the guards, who were waiting near by, arrested him and brought him to the city this morning.

MORE PEARS WANTED.

California Canneries After the Oregon Product.

A representative of the Associated Canneries of California was in the city yesterday trying to arrange to buy pears that could be had for shipment, says the Salem Journal. He had bought 10 carloads at Roseburg, and found a great many pears were in the country about here if we labor could be got to pick them.

He is anxious to get hold of all the Oregon pears, whether they will measure two and a half inches about the waist or not as the supply is short in California and the canneries must have them. If it will pay to ship pears to San Francisco to can, the grower can see what a margin there must be for pears for the canneries in Oregon at the prices that have been paid.

STATE MINING ASSOCIATION.

Oregon Mining Men Organize at Portland With Good Prospects for Future.

Portland, Sept. 8.—The Oregon State Mining Association was organized in this city, yesterday evening, at the rooms of the Chamber of Commerce. For the past two months the matter has been agitated throughout Oregon, and the only thing that worked against the meeting was the fact that it was called to take place, while the International Mining Congress was in session at Deadwood, S. D.

Many of the prominent mining men of the state are present at the Deadwood meeting, which reduced the attendance at this state meeting. One noticeable feature of the meeting was the very weak attendance from Eastern Oregon, the leading mining district of the state.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year:

- J. F. Wickham, of Galice, president.
- J. H. Fisk, of Portland, vice-president.
- L. Kelsure, of Baker City, second vice-president.
- A. L. Morris, of Portland, secretary.
- J. F. Watson, of Portland, treasurer.

Only one Eastern Oregon man was honored with an office, while over 60 per cent of the mines of the state are located in that district.

The association will take up the matter of mining legislation. It is the intention of the association, also, to advertise the mining industry of the state thoroughly, in the money centers of the East, with a view to further development of the great resources now untouched.
