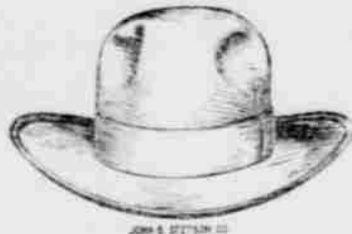

GENERAL NEWS.

Andrew Carnegie has been asked by the negroes to establish libraries in the South for the colored race.

Puffblower have been placed on the highways in New York, with field glasses, to lookout for daylight burglars.

Sir Thomas Lipton is suffering from appendicitis and physicians gave out yesterday that an operation would not be necessary.

A large sheet of stone roofing fell from the top of the 20-story Flatiron building in New York, yesterday, and a man standing a block away had his leg broken from a piece of the flying rock.

A reward of \$500 has been offered for the arrest of W. J. Kelly, legislative agent of the backing powder trust on the charge of conspiracy in connection with the Missouri legislative alum backing powder scandal. Kelly is believed to be in Canada.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

A manning party was found Sunday last in Tule Creek, near St. Helena, Or.

The Minnie Healy matter is in litigation at Helena, Mont. It is valued at \$100,000.

The new transcontinental freight rates will go into effect October 11. All points on the Pacific coast were affected.

Twelve arrests have been made of men suspected of robbing the Hotel Rhein at Tacoma. All have been released for lack of evidence.

The Fortune Mining Company of Spokane has bought the Red Lion group of mines in the Greenbelt district, Grant county, paying therefor \$250,000.

Es-Sheriff J. D. Young has won the suit against him on account of the destruction of papers and documents at the Bunker Hill mine, which was blown up by strikers with dynamite in 1899.

The demands of the joint-union bakers of Spokane are rejected by the employers, and a compromise is not in sight. The employers all say they will shut down rather than attempt to do business while saying the proposed scale.

According to the Portland Journal, surveys now in progress show that the bottom levels of the Willamette river opposite the Portland waterfront have not changed during the past three years. The river bottom is of an uncommonly stable quality compared with streams anywhere of an equal size.

W. G. Landers, alias M. G. Gable, was shot and killed by Sheriff Wharton of Butte, Mont., at Edna, Texas, while resisting arrest. On his person were diamonds valued at \$4,000. He was wanted in nearly every large city in the United States for forgery, including Portland, Seattle, San Francisco and Minneapolis. The killing at Edna was September 15.
