WET AND COOL WEEK

RANGE IS IMPROVING ALL OVER THE STATE.

Wheat is Not All Cut—Fall Plowing is in Progress—Damage to Hops From Lice and Mold Has Not Been Heavy—Two-thirds Crop of Apples.

The week has been wet and cool. Not more than two or three good days of harvesting weather occurred in any section, and the grain is short, has become damp and is in danger of sprouting. But little wheat remains to be cut and threshing is well advanced. In some sections, however, it will take at least two weeks longer before the grain is all harvested.

The soil has been sufficiently softened by the rains for fall plowing which is now being done in many places. Grass has made a new start and consequently feed in the pastures and on the ranges is good and stock is in excellent condition.

By the end of the week plowing will be practically completed. Rice and corn will have been more or less damaged, but the subsequent damage was not so great as expected, and the growers generally express themselves as quite pleased with the yields, both as to quantity and quality.

Corn is maturing slowly, as needs warmer weather. Potatoes might be reported to be spreading in the coast counties. Elsewhere this crop is in excellent condition.

Fruit drying has become general and with good weather during the next two weeks a big crop will be secured. Peas are ripe and being marketed as rapidly as possible. Late apples continue doing well and it is expected about two-thirds of an average crop will be harvested.

Columbia River Valley.

Grass Valley, Sherman county Geo. B. Bourhill—Weather cold with heavy showers Friday and Saturday, harvesting delayed, threshing not nearly all done, considerable wheat yet uncut, not much damage done as yet, but there will be a damp weather continues, very little grain delivered at warehouses.

Pendleton, Umatilla county H. J. Taylor—Heavy rain and some hail Thursday and heavy rain Friday night, ground wet enough for plowing, seeding will begin in about a week, or as soon as the weeds start up, grain all in warehouses, pasture poor, but will now start, potato crop good early potatoes ready for digging.

Weston, Umatilla county, Mand M. Baker—Cold and cloudy, raining all day Saturday with brief cessations, delay in threshing had for mountain ranchmen, though no damage to grain has occurred, most of the wheat in this locality safely stored, prune crop very heavy, potato yield less than usual.

Adams, Umatilla county, C. S. Ferguson—Latter part of week rainy with severe thunderstorms, Thursday, harvest nearly over, grain most all hauled to warehouses.

Plateau Region.

Baker City, Baker county, W. C. McGuire—Rainy and cool, considerable snow has fallen on the mountains during the latter part of the week, oats cut, last alfalfa crop is not yet harvested, the light frost on the morning of the 9th did no damage.

Union, Union county, John W. Minnick—Rains nearly every day, ground wet to good depth, threshing

hardly half done and wet weather is damaging every stack, while many fields are not cut yet, outside of the grain problem everything looks bright and cheerful, apples good, potatoes average, range cattle in the condition.

Ontario, Malheur county, A. L. Sprout—Weather fine, with high winds, which have damaged fruit, large quantities blown off the trees, third crop of alfalfa looking fine, harvesting well advanced, crops good.

Deschutes, Crook county, John Atkinson—First part of week cloudy, with light showers, latter clear and warm, with heavy frost at night, having about all done, stock in good condition.
