



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Criticizes the Transportation Compa-

nies and Newspapers-Times Are Dull Along the Yukon-Railroad Building Expensive-No New Gold Finds This Year.

Tacoma, Sept. 18 .- Henry Bratnober, of Oakland, Cal., who is interested in the banks at Tacoma and Helena, Mont., and who is a heavy stockholder in the Tacoma smelter, the Treadwell mines on Douglas Island. and in other mining property in Alaska and the Yukon territory, has just returned from a long tour through different parts of the North, and the report that he brings back is not encouraging. He is very bitter in his denunciations of those who are making efforts to get people to go to Alaska through false representations, and he blames transportation companies and the newspapers on the Sound and in Alaska for the suffering that he says is evident on every hand at the present time. Mr. Brantnober is a man whose word would never be questioned by those who know him. and the statements that he makes will undoubtedly prevent many people from spending money to go to a country where, he says, they can hope for no returns from the capital and time invested.

"Unless relief goes in from some where fully 100 men will perish in the Tanana country this winter. If the men could only get down as far as Fairbanks I believe they could get some provisions there. But the distance is 200 or 300 miles-too far for the majority of the men to walk. in their present emaciated condition. and the river is dangerous. A number of prospectors have already been drowned in trying to go down the river on rafts,

Men Without Experience.

"A majority of the men who go into these traps are not experienced prospectors and they make no provision for getting out. When they attempt to go out on rafts they build them too cumbersome and it is im possible to steer them. As a result the rafts either strike some rock in the middle of the stream and are torn One Night Only to pieces, or else they run under 'sweepers' near the bank and the out fits and men are brushed off. The outfits are always lost in cases of this kind. Sometimes the men manage to reach the shore and save their lives. But it not infrequently happens that the men go to the bottom of the river with the outfits,

Yukon Country is Dull. "I visited the Yukon country and it is not as prosperous as it was when I was last there two years ago. There are many idle men in Dawson and they are getting out of the country just as fast as they can. There will be little if anything doing in Dawson this winter. The ground that will be drifted is very scarce, and it does not pay to drift poor ground. "There have been no new discoveries in Alaska or the Yukon this year. A strong effort has been made to get up a stampede from White Horse to the Alaska River. I met some prospectors at White Horse, whom I knew to be good, reliable men. They had just returned from the so-called new diggings and they informed me that there was nothing there that would pay. The dust was very fine and in six or eight pans cnough of it could not be obtained to turn the scales. The gold does not prospect any better there than it does on the bars of the Yukon river. I hope that there will not be a stampede into that country, as those will surely perish who go in this fall. Railroad Building Expensive. "The building of railroads in Aleska will be an expensive proposition. It will cost not less than \$30,000 per mile to construct a railroad from Valdes to Eagle. There is nothing to build a railroad for yet, except to reach the copper deposits on White river, and the line from Valdes to Eagle would not go anywhere near these deposits. If a railway were built it might develop some better take many years to prospect Aleska, owing to the difficulty experienced in bringing in provisions."
