HARRIMAN WILL COMPETE WITH HILL FOR SUPREMACY.

Buys two Monster Steamers to Ply Between Sound and Orient-Francisco Lines Will Meet Any Cut in Rates.

Seattle, Sept. 26. — Trans-Pacific steamship officials at this port have at last come to the conclusion that E. H. Harriman of the Southern Pacific will use one if not both of the new steamships he purchased re-cently from the Atlantic Transporta-tion company to compete with the two mammoth steamships of James J. Hill in the Oriental trade.

Harriman's new boats are the Mon-golia and Manchuria. The former was launched about ten weeks ago. The Manchuria is soon to be launched. They each cost \$1,750. 000, having a length of 615 feet. They have a gross tennage of 13500 and 000, having a length of 615 feet. They have a gross tonnage of 13,500 and a passenger capacity of 356 first cabins, 68 second cabins and 1,300 steerage. One of them, with the Korea and Siberia, now in use, will be the Pacific Mail's San Francisco and Yokohama-Hongkong service.

The other new one, with the China and Peking will make direct service to Manila, it being the belief of Harriman and his associates that with-

riman and his associates that with-in eighteen months the government will withdraw from the business of a common carrier to the Pailippines.

As the time approaches for Hill put into service the Minnesota and Dakota between this port and the orient, these vessels being especially designed to carry immense cargoes at low rates, shipping men are wondering to what extent he will cut

It is believed here that the power of the Great Northern, Northern Precific and Burlington roads, which Hill has merged into the Northern Securities company, to gather freight in this country for shipment to the Orient will be more than a match for the Harriman roads with the Santa Fe and connections. He can make very low rates from the East to Seattle in order to bring back loaded many cars that are now

hauled empty from the East. But even so, it is admitted that no matter what rates Hill may make they will be met by the railroad-steamer lines via San Francisco. which have a fighting chance at least to w'n out, that San Francisco may maintain its lend of Seattle as the great Pacific coast port.

A great many farguers carry their crops for a long time after harvest waiting for an advance in prices. Those who need money can get a large part of the valu of their crop out in money and still hold the grain for an advance in the following

mainer.

Suppose a firmer has 5,000 bushels of wheat which he can sell at 65 cents a bushel; let him sell it and receive \$3,350 in payment; then let him buy 5,000 bushels of May wheat and margin it 5 cents a bushel. This will require \$250,00. He will then have \$3,000 to use as he sees fit If the price of May wheat goes up five cents per bushel, he will make \$250 the same as if he had held his 5,000 bushels of wheat in his granary.
