### FIGHT FOR TRADE

HARRIMAN WILL COMPETE WITH HILL FOR SUPREMACY.

Seattle, Sept. 26.—Trans-Pacific steamship officials at this port have at last come to the conclusion that E. H. Harriman of the Southern Pacific will use one if not both of the new steamships if he purchased recently from the Atlantic Transportation company to compete with the two mammoth steamships of James J. Hill in the Oriental trade.

Harriman's new boats are the Mongolia and Manchuria. The former was launched about ten weeks ago. The Manchuria is soon to be launched. They each cost \$1,750,000, having a length of 615 feet. They have a gross tonnage of 13,500 and a passenger capacity of 350 first cabins, 68 second cabins and 1,300 steerage. One of them, with the Korea and Siberia, now in use, will be the Pacific Mail's San Francisco and Yokohama-Hongkong service.

The other new one, with the China and Peking will make direct service to Manila, it being the belief of Harriman and his associates that within eighteen months the government will withdraw from the business of a common carrier to the Philippines.

As the time approaches for Hill to put into service the Minnesota and Dakota between this port and the Orient, these vessels being especially designed to carry immense cargoes at low rates, shipping men are wondering to what extent he will cut rates.

It is believed here that the power of the Great Northern, Northern Pacific and Burlington roads, which Hill has merged into the Northern Securities company, to gather freight in this country for shipment to the Orient will be more than a match for the Harriman roads with the Santa Fe and connections. He can make very low rates from the East to Seattle in order to bring back loaded many cars that are now hauled empty from the East.

But even so, it is admitted that no matter what rates Hill may make they will be met by the railroad-steamship lines via San Francisco, which have a fighting chance at least to win out, the San Francisco may maintain its lead as Seattle as the great Pacific coast port.

### BLINDED A DOG.

Brutal and Malicious Trick to a Fine Animal.

The following dispatch to the Portland Journal will interest the many people in this vicinity acquainted with the victim and his antecedents: Astoria, Sept. 24.—A. Scoggin, engineer at the Lindenberger Cold Storage plant, was arrested this evening on an information charging him with the malicious destruction of personal property. He was held under \$100 bonds to appear for examination in the Justice Court tomorrow. Scoggin is accused of having thrown a quantity of ammonia in the face and eyes of N. D. Paine's pointer dog Printer Boy, blinding the dog and ruining him. The animal is one of the finest pointers on the Pacific Coast, has taken first prize in every contest entered and is valued at \$1,000.

### STATE VETERINARY BOARD.

Dr. Christie, of Pendleton, Named by Governor Chamberlain.

Salem, Sept. 25.—Governor Chamberlain yesterday announced his appointment of the Oregon state veterinary medical board, created under the act of 1903, to be composed of the following members: Dr. William McLean and Dr. S. J. Carney, of Portland; Dr. James Withycombe, of Corvallis; Dr. James Christie, of Pendleton, and Dr. Alex. Reed, of Ione.

The appointments take effect immediately, and the chief duties of the board are to receive and examine into all reports of infection among the livestock of the state and to compile and issue information and statistics in regard to same, and to adopt a set of rules and regulations regarding the proper care of stock under all conditions.

### MONEY FOR LINEMEN.

Striking Telephone Men Get \$5,000 From National Body.

Spokane, Sept. 25.—The Electrical Workers' Union met at Central Labor hall last night and a communication from the Western Conference from San Francisco was read, stating that the international convention, now in session in Salt Lake, had voted the strikers \$5,000. According to the report from San Francisco, there are 1,500 men out on strike against the Pacific States Telephone & Telegraph Company.

In San Francisco an appeal has been sent out to all local unions to lend the strikers every financial aid, as down there the stubborn resistance of the company is taken to be the great test between organized labor and the employers' association.

### How to Sell a Crop and Still Have it.

A great many farmers carry their crops for a long time after harvest waiting for an advance in prices. Those who need money can get a large part of the value of their crop out in money and still hold the grain for an advance in the following manner.

Suppose a farmer has 5,000 bushels of wheat which he can sell at 75 cents a bushel; let him sell it and receive \$3,750 in payment; then let him buy 5,000 bushels of May wheat and margin it 5 cents a bushel. This will require \$375.00. He will then have \$3,375.00 to use as he sees fit if the price of May wheat goes up five cents per bushel, he will make \$250 the same as if he had held his 5,000 bushels of wheat in his granary.

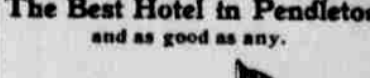

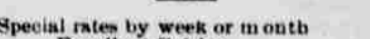
