IRRIGATION

SETTLERS ARE LOCATING ALL AVAILABLE RESERVOIR SITES.

Eastern Oregon Farmers Decide That short water. the Growing of Three Alfalfa Crops Does Not Pay-Would Raise Two Good Crops and Then Pasture the Fields.

Ontario, Sept. 30 .- Reservoir fever as struck Eastern Oregon and is doing its best work in Malheur and Harney counties. Al the way from the small "hole in the ground" up to the immense reservoir site of many hundred acres this feature of future irrigation is considered good propery and is being sought after as never before. Far back up the isolated stream which goes dry in early sum-

mer every good opportunity for storing the early waters of the season is being taken by energetic men who have been stirred by forethought. The celebrated Harper's ranch that has done so much toward the historical part of Malheur county and which is situated on the Malheur river, 30 miles above Ontarlo is just now being investigated by the federal government with a view of pur-chasing the entire 2,000 acres for reservoiring the torrential waters of the Malheur river.

Speculators Busy.

Up on the head of the Owhee river the larger reservoir sites have been taken by those who suppose that the government will take them later at a good round price, or that by some turn of affairs some other source of speculation will turn up therefrom. individuals are hunting up smaller sites where even one farm may be up smaller reclaimed. Everywhere the reservoir is destined to come into common use. The Starks project near Ontario.

through which several thousand acres of land across the river from Pay-ette and Weiser will be watered, has once more been financed. The invesligation of the reservoir sites on the Malheur river, 30 miles above the headgate of this Starks ditch, was no small part of the influence that enabled the promoters to enlist another \$30,000 in the building of this muchneeded canal.

Only Two Crops Pay.

Eastern Oregon alfalfa raisers in this section are just beginning to decide that three-crop alfalfa does not pay as against the two-crop practice. The third cutting is always light and is of a poor quality, while if the sec-ond crop is allowed to remain longer in the field the arst crop having also got a little more strength before it is cut, the aggregate yield contains all the nutriment that is possible in the three crops.
