NEW EXPERIMENT. Stockmen Will Drive Herds to Port tand.

Stockmen in the neighborhood of Antone will gather up several car-loads of cattle, cows and steers, and drive them to the Portland market, where they will dispose of them to the butchers and porkers. The stock will be driven through The Dalle and there loaded on hoats for the re-mainder of the journey.






