tion Projects-Water sources Must Be Protected-Three Sources of Objections to Government's Policy.

Gifford Pinchot, chief of the divi-sion of forestry of the United States, delivered the following address at the late Ogden Irrigation Congress. The address has not been published in full, only excerpts from it having appeared at the time. It outlines the aim of the government in creating the forest reserves of the West: "President Roosevelt has said that

the principal object of the forest pol-icy of the United States is, and must be, to make prosperous homes and to keep them prosperous. The ob-Ject of the government in dealing with the forest reserves is, therefore, to give them their greatest permanent usefulness to the settler and the home. maker. Wise forest administration is impossible without a knowledge of local conditions and local needs, and without the careful adaptation of the forest reserves rules to meet those needs

"In the delicate and important task of administering the forest reserves which are r vitally necessary to the vellbeing of industries and West, communities throughout the government is constantly met the demands of conflicting interests. In each case it is essential that the administration of the reserve should be given its highest possible present usefulness, while protecting with the greatest care its continued utility to the community. The idea of perma-nent usefulness is fundamental in every case.

The four great timber-using industrics-lumbering, building, mining, and transportation-are peculiarly dependent for their future prosperity upon a sustained supply of timber from the government forest reserves, and special provisions must be made to meet their needs. The use of the mature timber is

often essential and almost universal-ly advisable in a healthy growing forest, and provision is made by the law for its disposition to those who need it. This use of the reserves will grow steadily greater and more es-sential as time goes on, and every care should be taken to safeguard the young growth for the future 'For the present, much the most

important use of the forest reserve is to supply water to the irrigator, and their utility in this respect should be safeguarded in every possible way. This use, too, will increase with time and it will become more and more evident that the foundation of the irrigation development of the West lies in the wise administration the forest reserves. 01

Not only can the present supplies water be conserved by the right handling of the forest, but there is no question whatever that in many localities they may be largely in-creased. From this point of view, as well as from many others, protec-tion against fire is the first duty of the government toward the reserves. "Opposition to the forest reserve policy has arisen chiefly from three sources-first, misunderstanding of the government's policy in the cre-ation of reserves; second, vexatious and unnecessary delays and restric-tions certain to disappear as the reserve management improves, but for the present time a serious hindrance to the usefulness of the reserves; third, the sudden disturbance of business conditions when a reserve is created has sometimes in the past


