REFORM SCHOOL

ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY INMATES OCTOBER 1.

Work on New Building Progressing—Largest Crops This Year Ever Raised on the Farm—Sewer System to Be Improved—General Health Good—Discipline is Excellent.

H. E. Bickers, retiring superintendent of the state reform school, in his last report says:

"With the exception of a few weeks relaxation from school work during harvest, the usual routine in both the school and industrial departments has continued, and the general discipline was never better or of a higher order."

"Work on the new industrial building is progressing satisfactory and the contractors expect to finish the same on or before the first of November. Wood contracts are all filled, with the exception of two small lots, and the quality of the wood received this year is above the average and the quantity sufficient for the needs of the institution until October, 1904."

"Good weather during the summer and fall have given us opportunity to harvest and house in good shape, probably the largest crop of hay, grain, fruit and vegetables raised on the farm during the existence of the institution. There are in the several barns, at this time about 125 tons of hay, 2,000 bushels of oats; also about 150 tons of corn and vetch ensilage, filling the two silos in the cow barn to overflowing, besides furnishing and cutting 45 tons of corn ensilage for the mule school."

"On the first of July there were 119 boys in the school; we have received since that date on first commitment four; returned from parole and leave of absence two; paroled and away on leave of absence eleven, leaving in the school on September 1, '03."

Dr. A. E. Tammitse, physician at the school, reports the health of the school as being good, and the sanitary conditions remain much the same, but will be greatly improved by the contemplated addition to the sewer system of the septic tank affording modern means for the proper disposition of the sewerage."

HELD WITHOUT BAIL.

C. M. Donkel, of Deschutes, Must Answer for His Father's Murder.

The Dalles, Oct. 8.—C. M. Donkel, charged with the murder of his father, on the Deschutes river, yesterday came before the justice of the peace at Prineville for preliminary examination. The prisoner waived examination and was held to appear at the next term of circuit court without bonds.

This was one of the most brutal murders in the history of Oregon. The father and son had been traveling together and after separating, the corpse of the father of young Donkel was found buried under the ashes of his camp fire.

Suspect at once pointed to the son, as he was last seen with his father, and after missing his parent made no apparent effort to find him. A fresh grave was found, covered by a huge camp fire and the corpse of the old gentleman was found there about a week after the murder.
