AMERICAN BANKERS

MANY MEN OF MANY
MILLIONS HAVE MET.

National Association in Session at San Francisco—Will Discuss Questions of Finance and Banking—Will be in Session Three Days.

San Francisco, Cal., Oct. 17.—Strangers of dignified bearing and prosperous appearance are much in evidence today about the streets and public places of San Francisco, and page after page of the hotel registers is filling with the names of men whose signatures are good for millions. The visitors form the advance guard of delegates to the twenty-ninth annual convention of the American Bankers' association to be held here during the coming week. The first of the delegates put in an appearance this morning and from now until Monday night all regular trains and numerous specials will arrive filled with delegates from the East, South and Middle states. The membership of the association extends to every prominent financial center in the country and represents a larger aggregate of capital than any other organization in the world.

The business sessions of the convention will be held in the California Theater and will last from Monday until Saturday. Speeches will be made by many prominent men, including the governor of California; Hon. William B. Ridgely, comptroller of the currency, and Hon. Ellis H. Roberts, treasurer of the United States. One of the chief features of the convention will be the report of the special committee appointed last year to prepare a plan of currency adjustment. This committee will report on the first day of the session, and it is expected the report will form the basis for a thorough discussion of the currency question. The special committee consists of Charles S. Fairchild, former secretary of the treasury; H. C. Fahnestock of New York; Homer S. King of San Francisco; Myron T. Herrick of Cleveland and J. J. Mitchell of Chicago.

The Three Days' Program.

The interesting feature of the three days' program will be as follows:

First day—Convention called to order at 10 a. m., by the president, Caldwell Hardy of Norfolk, Va.; prayer by the Right Rev. William Ford Nichols, bishop Episcopal diocese of California; address of welcome to the city of San Francisco by Mayor Eugene E. Schmitz; address of welcome to the state of California by Governor George C. Pardee; address of welcome on behalf of San Francisco bankers by Hon. James D. Phelan; reply to addresses of welcome and annual address by the president of the association; annual report of the secretary, James R. Branch of New York; address by L. P. Hillyer, cashier of the American National Bank at Macon, Ga. Then will follow a meeting of the delegates from states and territories to appoint a nominating committee.

Second day—Practical banking questions discussed. Address by Comptroller Ridgely on the subject, "Currency." An address by Homer S. King, president of the Wells, Fargo Bank, San Francisco. Address by J. E. McAshen on the subject, "Money Supplies of the United States." Statements will then be made by the bankers as to the business conditions of the various states.

Third day—General discussion of practical banking questions; an address by Hon. Ellis H. Roberts on the "Effects of the Inflow of Gold;" address by J. B. Finley, president Fifth National Bank, Pittsburg, on the subject, "Education of Bank Clerks;" report of the committee on nominations; election and installation of officers.

The trust company section will hold its convention in the California Theater beginning at 10 a. m. Tuesday. The convention of the savings bank section will be held the same day in the Academy of Sciences building.

The scenic beauties surrounding San Francisco has enabled the committee on entertainment to prepare a program of unexcelled attractiveness. The various features will include an excursion to the Santa Clara valley, visits to Del Monte, Monterey, Palo Alto, Mt. Tamalpais and numerous other points, and also a steamboat ride about San Francisco Bay. In addition there will be a reception at Mark Hopkins Institute, a theatrical performance, a promenade concert and an aquatic entertainment at Sutro's Baths.

PIRATE CAPTURED.

Short Career of Scoundrelly Government Official.

Manila, Oct. 16.—The capture of Inspector Herrman, who, with Officer Johnson, stole government funds in Mindanao and then turned pirate, was announced today. He was found in the mountains of Negros carrying \$1,700.

Paducah, Ky., Oct. 16.—Bob Douglas, the negro who shot Crockett Childress, a white boy, Sunday, was lynched early this morning. The jailer was forced to deliver the keys. The boy lives, but is in a critical condition.

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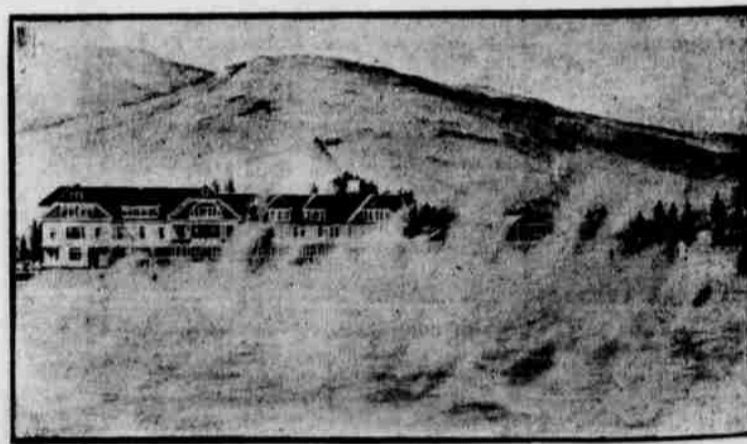
