IN GOLDEN STATE

BANKERS' MEETING CONVENES
IN A BLAZE OF GLORY.

Address of President Hardy, One of
the Features of the Day—Early Ad-
journalment Taken to Permit Visitors
to Take Excursion to the Bay.

San Francisco, Cal., Oct. 21.—When
the 29th annual meeting of the Amer-
ican Bankers' Association was called
to order at 10 o'clock this morning
by President Caldwell Hardy, of Nor-
folk, Va., the auditorium of the Cali-
fornia theatre was filled with mem-
bers of the association, while the offi-
cers and executive council occupied
seats on the stage.

The ladies who came to the con-
vention occupied the boxes. Mayor
Schmitz welcomed the association to
the city of San Francisco, and Gov-
ernor Pardee assured the visitors of
California's hearty welcome. Hon.
James D. Phelan, speaking for the
San Francisco bankers, also greeted
the members.

President Hardy, in his annual ad-
dress, discussed questions of vital im-
portance to the association. President
Hardy spoke for half an hour and his
address was the feature of the ses-
sion. The next half hour was devoted
to routine business, several reports
being read and accepted. An early ad-
journalment was taken to permit the
visitors to take an excursion on the
bay as guests of the local committee.

The address of President Hardy was
optimistic in the extreme. He sees
nothing but prosperity ahead for the
government and peace for both labor
and capital.

Temporary clouds in the industrial
horizon will soon pass over and the
great manufacturing centers of the
East will arise from the transient
lethargy, imposed by labor difficulties
and the volume of money will swell
as the business of the country ex-
pands.

Very little reference was made to
the coming financial legislation to be
enacted by congress.

San Francisco is in gala attire, the
city is decorated for the occasion,
and the many distinguished financiers
present are being entertained in elab-
orate style.

BATTLE MONUMENT.

Commemorates Buckeyes at the Bat-
tle of Missionary Ridge.

Chattanooga, Tenn., Oct. 21.—The
monument erected by the state of
Ohio to the soldiers from that state
who fought and fell in the battle of
Missionary Ridge was formally dedi-
cated today in the presence of a large
and distinguished delegation from the
Buckeye state. The principal oration
was delivered by Gen. Charles F.
Standerson, former United States sen-
ator from Nebraska.

The monument occupies a conspicu-
ous site in full view of Chattanooga,
Orchard Knob and Lookout Mountain.
It consists of a colossal obelisk, 90
feet in height, with four bronze figures
at the base, representing the infantry,
artillery and cavalry branches and a
drummer boy.

Movement to Bring All Interests of
Church into Harmony.

Battle Creek, Mich., Oct. 21.—Many
delegates and visitors are here for the
sixty-seventh annual Baptist state
convention, which will be in session
during the next three days. The pro-
ceedings formally open this evening
with President R. B. Loomis presiding.
The principal feature of the opening
session will be an address by Rev.
E. B. Hulbert, D. D., of Chicago.

One of the matters of special inter-
est to come before the present con-
vention for consideration and action
will be the report of a committee of
fifteen, appointed to consider methods
whereby the various interests of the
church may be brought into closer
harmony, and thus do more effective
work.

RAILROAD CONSOLIDATION.

Denver and Rio Grande Will Purchase
the Crystal River Line.

Denver, Colo., Oct. 21.—The prin-
cipal business before today's special
meeting of the stockholders of the
Denver and Rio Grande Railroad com-
pany is to authorize the purchase of
the Crystal River railroad. For the
purpose of making the purchase and
for future capital requirements the
first preferred capital stock is to be
increased by \$5,000,000. This will
raise the total first preferred capital
stock of the Rio Grande to \$50,000,
000. The regular annual meeting of
the road will be held here tomorrow.

VETERAN ACTRESS.

Eighty-Three Years Old and Still Ac-
tively at Work.

Boston, Mass., Oct. 21.—Never in
better health and as eager for work
as the youngest beginner, Mrs. G. H.
Gilbert, 83 years old today, went

through her role in "Mice and Men"
at the matinee performance at the
Park theatre this afternoon. It was
a day of greeting and congratulation,
and when the favorite actress stepped
upon the stage the audience gave her
a sincere and hearty reception, such
as few artists can boast of.

Missouri's Official Trial.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 21.—The
Navy Department is awaiting with in-
terest the results of the official trial
of the battleship Missouri, which
takes place today over the New Eng-
land course. Experts who have in-
spected this ship express confidence
in her ability to more than meet the
speed requirements of 18 1/2 knots.
