GENERAL NEWS.

The glassworkers of Pittsburg have had their wages advanced 5 per cent.

The widow of Rev. Charles Spurgeon, the famous English Baptist missionary, died in London October 22. She survived her husband nearly 12 years.

Charles Kratz, a member of the St. Louis city council, indicted for bribery, jumped his bond and fled. He has been captured at Guadalajara, Mexico, and will be extradited.

Three thousand men, women and boys employed in Chicago meat canning and sausage establishments, have presented a demand for increase of wages from 10 to 25 per cent.

C. S. Hanaw, aged 26, suicided in New York because he was short in his accounts \$43, and could not explain the deficiency. He was bookkeeper and confidential clerk for a large wholesale house.

During 1902 there were 8,208 deaths of infants in Chicago; in 1901 there were 5,144. It is certain that there will be many fewer deaths of infants in 1903 than last year. The influence of women's clubs and sanitary societies, resulting in better sanitary conditions in general and particularly an improved milk supply, get the credit for the decreasing death ratio.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

The raisin crop in the vicinity of Fresno, Cal., for this year amounts to 54,000,000 pounds, against 42,000,000 pounds last year.

Admiral T. Johnson, a self-confessed highwayman, was sentenced to five years in the penitentiary from Portland, Thursday.

Albert Martin and Scott Lane, two Siletz Indians, are under arrest for murdering U. S. Grant, another of their tribesmen, at Woodman, on the Siletz river, Thursday morning.

The Union Pacific boiler-makers and machinists are threatening another strike. They are greatly dissatisfied with the piecework system, which the company employs in its shops.

Harry Powers, an insane man, was found almost dead, in the woods near Chehalis, Wash., Thursday, from exposure. He was feeding on snails and lizards and was in a deplorable condition.

The city of Aberdeen is being built up again, with more substantial buildings than ever. Already some 50 buildings are under way, and property is selling at greatly advanced prices, and labor is scarce.

Charles M. Patterson, of Portland, died Thursday from injuries received in a burning building last Monday. His wife was burned to death at that time, and he lingered in terrible suffering. They were buried in one grave.

Fire destroyed the Columbia hotel at The Dalles, Thursday morning. The origin of the fire is unknown, and the loss is about \$3,000, partly insured. The building belonged to T. Nicholas, of The Dalles, and was run by Dufur & Batty. It was one of the oldest houses in the city.

Judge John H. Scott, president of the Oregon Good Roads Society, has been appointed delegate from the state of Oregon to attend the coming session of congress, to work for the passage of the Brownlow bill, which provided for the improvement of country roads by the national government.

PORTLAND EDITOR PRAISES

WALLA WALLA ENERGY.

Says the Fair and Race Association Shows Great Enterprise — Was Built From Ground Up, This Season—Such Organizations Help Live Stock Industry.

The following interview with M. D. Wisdom, in the Walla Walla Statesman, is something that will be read with interest by the stockmen and business men of Umatilla county. The same thoughts and suggestions as given in this interview apply with equal force to this county.

The fact that Walla Walla began on the ground, built, and equipped a mile track and fair ground this season is astonishing to Mr. Wisdom. His praises of that sort of enterprise should be a stimulus to Umatilla county to imitate the energy and push of the Garden City.

The Statesman says:

"Walla Walla's race meet and fair, compares favorably with any held in the Northwest this year and I have attended them all," Mr. Wisdom said at the track this morning. "Although in point of numbers the cattle show is behind several I have attended this season, the quality of stock shown is the best product of the West and will act as an incentive for breeders to come here next year with their herds."

"Walla Walla, situated as she is in the center of one of the most prolific agricultural districts in the Northwest, should encourage the industry of raising fine cattle, and an annual stock show in connection with the races and fair every year would do much toward developing the industry. The natural surroundings are much more favorable for the industry than at many places in the East which have become noted for the fancy stock they produce."

Mr. Wisdom is much impressed with the hustling ability of the directors of the Walla Walla County Fair Association. Last spring he was in Walla Walla and at that time not even a site for the new association grounds had been selected. That the new mile track and buildings had been constructed in so short a time he said seemed marvelous. The new mile track, he stated, promised in another year to become the fastest on the Northwest circuit, and the excellent inducements offered to horsemen will result in many of them wintering their strings here.

Mr. Wisdom will spend the balance of the week in the city attending the races and conferring with stockmen.
