HARNESS THE FALLS

**SENATOR CLARK'S GREAT
WATER POWER SCHEME.**

Will Utilize Shoshone Falls in Idaho
—Expects to Generate 40,000 Horse-
Power — Most Stupendous Power
Plant in Inland Empire.

In the consummation of his long
cherished plan to harness the famed
his determination that the natural
Shoshone falls, Senator W. A. Clark
of Montana, has adhered strictly to
his determination that the natural
beauty of the magnificent cataract
should not be marred, says the Boise
Statesman. Columns have been writ-
ten regarding the noted project from
time to time and frequently the an-
nouncement was made that the sen-
ator was ready to carry out his pet
enterprise. But the Montana mil-
lionaire held back until he could see
his way clear to bring matters to a
head in the way he desired.

N. M. Ruick, Mr. Clark's attorney
in this city, had kept in close touch
with the senator all the while, nurs-
ing the project along and unraveling
the tangled knots as they were en-
countered. Mr. Ruick gathered his
lines together recently and held a
conference with the senator at which
the plan was discussed in detail and
put in tangible form. Drafts of the
power plant were prepared and an
application was made by Mr. Ruick
to the state engineer of Idaho for
permission to divert water from the
river above the falls.

Details of the Work.
The diversion of the water will be
effected by means of a tunnel 2,200
feet in length, the headgate of which
will be located 600 feet above the
falls in a deep, still pool not far from
the ferry.

The top of the tunnel will be five
feet below the low-water line, with an
open cut in the rock leading to the
headgate which will be set back in
solid lava rock. This plan will not
deface the natural formation of the
river bank in the least and will pre-
sent to the eye no evidence that the
hand of man has been at work.

The tunnel, which will have an
arched top 15 feet in height with 10-
foot side walls, will be 25 feet in
width, blasted in lava rock all the
way. From the headgate the tunnel
will run southward parallel with the
shore line for a distance of 500 feet,
curving to the right at an angle of 20
degrees for 400 feet, then running
west 1,500 feet to a point opposite the
power house, passing 100 feet
south of the hotel. The tunnel will
be 40 feet below the surface of the
ground.

Immense Power.
The power house, which will be 250
feet long and 90 feet wide, will be set
in solid rock on the south side in a
little cove 800 feet below the falls.
From the end of the tunnel to the
power house the water will come
down in eight iron pipes, each pipe
nine feet in diameter. These pipes
will drop 210 feet to twin horizontal
turbines coupled direct to the electric
generators.

Each generator will furnish 5,000
horse-power units, making a total of
40,000 horse-power. The tail-races
will also be excavated from solid
rock and the power house will pre-
sent a handsome though unobtrusive
front and will add to the beauty of
the cove, besides furnishing an ex-
cellent view of the falls from below.
