

SHERMAN COUNTY IN GOOD FINANCIAL CONDITION No Vacant Lands Left in the County -Farming Lands Selling at \$25 Per

-Acre and Upwards in That District-Wheat Yield and Price Good. Good prices and the sale of crops at the precise psychological moment, when all things combine for the farm-

ers' good, has almost completely routed the mortgage man in Sherman county, says a Portland paper. C. J. Bales, a resident of Portland, who owns 800 acres of wheat land in Sherman county, says the farmers of that region have done well this year in spite of the light yield, as the price netted made up for the crop shortage. Mr. Bales obtained 72½ cents a bushel for his wheat, which averaged 18 bushels to the acre, and he thinks this is a fair estimate of the entire yield of Sherman county for

Sherman county farmers are near ly all out of debt," he said today, "and the mortgages that were so numerous a few years ago have nearly all been canceled. The few mortgages that now appear on the county records are the result of individual farmers buying their peighbors out to extend

the lands of the purchaser.

There is no longer any vacant land in Sherman county, and even the 'scab' lands of the southern portion have been taken up. By 'scab' lands is meant the rocky hillsides facing the north and west, where the con-stant winds have blown the soil nway. These lands are well fitted for graz-ing purposes, but not for wheat rais-

"Farming lands cannot be bought now for less than \$25 an acre, and at this rate they will pay good interest on the investment."

Mr. Bales has been in that portion of eastern Oregon for the past 20 years, and has witnessed the changes from an uninhabited prairie to a land of well-tilled farms, dotted with pros-perous towns along the line of the Columbia Southern railroad. His place is near Wasco, some ten miles west of the Columbia river, where the land is level enough to permit of the use of the "combined harvester."
