# ARE WITHIN THE LAW

FULL APPLICATION OF INHERITANCE TAX.

Property Outside the State But a Part of a Devised Estate, Can be "Figured in" to Make a Total of \$10,000 and Thus Subject the Oregon Fraction to the Tax.

Portland, Nov. 20.—The new inheritance tax law provides that all estates appraised at \$10,000 or over are subject to taxation. The question has arisen whether an \$11,000 estate, in which only \$4,000 worth of the property is located in Oregon, comes within the provisions of the law. Or, in other words, if the estate in Oregon is valued at less than \$10,000, and the entire estate, parts of which are located in various parts of the country, is appraised at \$10,000 or more, is the property in Oregon subject to taxation under the inheritance law tax?

An opinion expressed by numerous attorneys is that if an estate amounts to \$10,000, or more, and only a portion of the property is in Oregon, the Oregon property is liable to taxation under the law.

Under the new law the county clerk sends a list of all estates filed to the state treasury and secretary of states and also notifies these officers when inventories are filed and the amount of the same. Executors and administrators, whose estates are appraised at \$10,000 are required by the law to send a copy of the inventory to the secretary of state, who, having been previously informed by the county clerk, knows if any executor or administrator fails to conform with the law.

If estates where the property in Oregon is less than \$10,000 and where there is enough property situated elsewhere to make up the difference, are made to pay the tax, the revenue received by the state will be increased considerably, as there are not a few of such cases.

The statute was carefully prepared so that the tax cannot be evaded by people transferring their holdings by deed to relatives, the deeds to take effect after death. The records in the recorder's office are watched for deeds by one member of a family to another where the consideration named is nominal or love and affection, to ascertain whether the intent is to escape the inheritance tax.

## EXIT SLOT MACHINES.

Seattle People Making a Vigorous Raid on the Owners.

Balked in their efforts to escape "Scott" free by demanding jury trials the merchandise paying slot machine operators whom Under Sheriff Corcoran caused to be arrested, several weeks ago, are now endeavoring to throw the costs of their prosecution upon the state, claiming that the slot machine law makes no provision for the payment of costs by the defendant, even if convicted, says the Seattle Star.

The question will be argued before Justice George within a few days by Attorney H. C. Gill for the defense, and Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Krete for the state. By some lawyers the question is said to

be simple, in fact no question at all. Easy claim that the costs follow the fine. The defense in the slot-machine cases claims different, however, and argues that there is no statute to that effect.

If the costs do not follow the fine the county will be deriving no revenue whatever from the slot-machine men who have been arrested for conducting their machines. The jury-men receive \$1 per day for their services, besides 20 cents each for mileage.

For the six men this amounts to \$7.20. Two witnesses besides the deputy sheriff making the arrest were sworn in each of the other cases. These fees of these witnesses amounted \$4.40. The total costs, not including the regular court costs, were \$11.60 in each of the cases. For the three it was \$34.80. If the costs are not paid the state will receive but \$20 and be out of pocket \$14.80.

That is just what the slot-machine combine wants. The defendants wish to make the prosecutions so expensive that they will be let alone. Attorney Gill will argue that all the defendant has to pay in the cases is the fine and the state shall stand the balance of the costs.

## HATCHERY CLOSED.

Ontario Salmon Manufactory Now Closed for Winter.

Ontario, Ore., Nov. 20.—Monday day witnessed the closing of the spawning season at the Ontario hatchery. The anticipated number of eggs has not been obtained, owing to the inclemency of the weather.

The weather has been quite unfavorable for this kind of business for the last couple of weeks. However, all things considered, we have had quite a successful spawning season, 20,000,000 eggs having been deposited in the hatching troughs.

From present indications it is safe to assume that 90 per cent of these eggs will hatch and be planted in the waters of Snake river and from nine to twelve months after they have been planted about 90 per cent of them will reach tide water, where it is quite reasonable to suppose 10 per cent of them will be devoured by the various inhabitants of the briny deep, thus leaving 90 per cent of those that reach the salt water to return four years hence.

## WILL MEET IN PORTLAND.

North Pacific Fair Association Will Follow Livestock Meeting to That City.

The North Pacific Fair Association, which comprises all the principal cities of the northwest, at which fall fairs are held, including Salem, North Yakima, Spokane, Boise, Seattle and other Northwest towns, will meet in Portland to arrange dates for next year, on January 15 and 16, immediately following the meeting of the National Livestock Association in that city.

This meeting was scheduled to take place at Everett, Wash., but owing to the fact that most of the stockmen interested would be in Portland, in attendance on the livestock meeting, the place was changed to Portland. The committee in charge of these fair dates is as follows: M. D. Wisdom, Portland; J. B. Stetson, Boise; C. D. Jeffries, Spokane; A. T. Vandewater, Seattle; and Dr. T. D. Gunn, North Yakima.

## WILL SCOUR WOOL.

Spokane to Have the Only Scouring Plant in the Northern Idaho and Washington District.

William White, of Las Vegas, N. M., who passed through this morning on the east-bound O. R. & N. train from Spokane, will start a wool scouring plant in that city to cost about \$10,000, which will handle 2,000,000 pounds of wool annually.

At the present time all the Northern Washington and Idaho wool must be sent to Montana points to be scoured and baled, and the amount of wool handled at Spokane justifies the industry at that point.

Mr. White operates a large scouring and baling plant at Albuquerque, N. M., and will locate permanently in Spokane, if the business opening proves to be encouraging as it appears on the surface.

## MISSOURI EDITORS.

Newspaper Men in Session at St. Joseph—A Two Days' Meeting.

St. Joseph, Mo., Nov. 20.—Members of the Northwest Missouri Press association was called to order by President G. W. Calvert of Dearborn. After an invocation by the Rev. Hastings McNamee, the visitors were cordially greeted by President T. B. Campbell of the Commercial Club. The appointment of committees and other perfunctory business occupied the rest of the session. Upon reassembling after luncheon the editors took up the discussion of various questions relating to the editorial and business management of newspapers. The convention will continue in session through tomorrow.

Large Number of Teachers Gathered in Minnesota.

Winona, Minn., Nov. 20.—"Education for Citizenship" is the central theme of the annual meeting of the Southeastern Minnesota Educational association, which opened in Winona today. Dr. J. F.
