WHAT THE WORLD DRINKS.

Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages in Various Countries.

A writer in Harper's Weekly calls attention to some interesting facts which have been recently brought to light regarding the comparative consumption of alcoholic beverages in various countries. France, it appears, bears off the palm, with a record of 18.5 litres (a litre is a little more than a quart) per year. Switzerland consumes 13 1/2 litres; Italy and Denmark, 10 litres; England, Germany and Austria, 9; Holland, 6; the United States, 5, and Canada, 2.

There may be hope for France's future, though, for England, where there is a special effort now to restrict the indulgence of the drunken, has in 25 years reduced her annual per capita

allowance from 10 litres to 9. The great trouble at present in France seems to be that the government is not strong enough to restrict the manufacture and sale of liquors. There are very nearly 500,000 wine shops in France, and last year, in spite of repressive legislation, there were 1,127,328 private distilleries who made alcohol or brandy from their own produce for their own use.

The greatest flood in 80 years is devastating the entire length of the Neva river, and St. Petersburg is suffering greatly. Twenty thousand people have been driven from their homes in that city by the flood.

Santiago, Chile, will have \$5,000,000 expended upon its sewage system by the Chilean congress.
