Evolutions Will Be Conducted for Four Months-An Entire Month Devoted to Target Practice-Greatest Affair of the Nature Ever Conducted by This Government,

Washington, Nov. 30.—The general washington, Nov. 30.—The general board of the navy, of which Admiral Dewey is president, is well pleased over the bright outlook that exists for the success of the winter maneuvers in the Cariblean. The plans, which have just been completed in their final detail, have been drawn on a more elaborate scale than anything of the kind previously extremeted by of the kind previously attempted by

The movements incident to the evolutions practically begin this week with the assembling of a dozen or more battleships, cruisers and other craft of war in Hampton Roads prior to departing for the scene of the maneuvers. For four full months the evolutions will continue and all of the squadrons in the Atlantic will take

Target Practice in March.

The ships will be under command of the senior squadron commander, except during the months of Febru-ary one March, when Admiral Dowey will again heist his four-starred pennant and assume direction of the competition in which records are to be made in target firing and fleet evo-lations. The entire month of March will be devoted to shooting. This target practice will take place in the vicinity of Florida bay.

In accordance with the elaborate program arranged by the general

board, the coast and Caribbean squad-rons assemble at Hampton Roads this week. The coast squadron will make Key West the rendezvous, while the Cartibean will use Guantaname as one of them. Chief among these exercises will be the campaign of an expeditionary force of 400 marines from the Dixie, which will be ordered to establish a base on the coast of Porto Rico to provide for its defense and to engage equate objective point, wrohably the capture of one of the island munici-... Material capture of one of the island will be pallities. This expedition will be away from the ships for a period of fifteen or twenty days. The men will, therefore, have to transport all their supplies and ammunition of war as in an actual campaign.

For nine days prior to February 15 the fleet will be maneuvered at sea, arriving at Guentanamo February 18. From that day until March 1 is to be sllowed the ships to refit and reach Florida bay, prepared to go into the record-making competition, which is to be held during the month of March. The competition will be the first among individual gunners on each ship, then between gun crews on the same ship, then between ships and finally between whole squadrons. All the work that is done before March 1 will be but a preparation for what may be termed the finals in this great shooting tournament


