NAVAL MANEUVERS

CONDUCTED THIS YEAR IN CARIBBEAN WATERS.

Evolutions Will Be Conducted for Four Months—An Entire Month Devoted to Target Practice—Greatest Affair of the Nature Ever Conducted by This Government.

Washington, Nov. 30.—The general board of the navy, of which Admiral Dewey is president, is well pleased over the bright outlook that exists for the success of the winter maneuvers in the Caribbean.

The movements incident to the evolutions practically begin this week with the assembling of a dozen or more battleships, cruisers and other craft of war in Hampton Roads prior to departing for the scene of the maneuvers.

Target Practice in March.

The ships will be under command of the senior squadron commander, except during the months of February and March, when Admiral Dewey will again hold his four-starred pennant and assume direction of the competition in which records are to be made in target firing and fleet evolutions.

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The European squadron, it is planned, will assemble at St. Vincent's, Cape Verde Islands, and arrive at Culebra a few days before the date set for the beginning of the evolutions.

Moot War in Porto Rico.

Chief among these exercises will be the campaign of an expeditionary force of 400 marines from the Dixie, which will be ordered to establish a base on the coast of Porto Rico to provide for its defense and to engage in operations leading up to some adequate objective point, probably the capture of one of the island municipalities.

For nine days prior to February 15 the fleet will be maneuvered at sea, arriving at Guantnamo February 18. From that day until March 1 is to be allowed the ships to refit and reach Florida bay, prepared to go into the record-making competition, which is to be held during the month of March.

Baker City, Nov. 30.—The mandate of the supreme court in the case of Pleasant Armstrong was returned yesterday to County Clerk Combs. Judge Enkin says he still has the matter under consideration, as he is as yet unable to say what he will do in the matter or when he will be ready to make public his decision.
