PENDLETON RETAIL MARKETS

Quotations on Staples Furnished by Local Merchants and Revised Daily.

Although hay is very scarce in almost every portion of the county and Eastern Oregon, there has not been any appreciable raise in the price in Pendleton. Bran and mill feed are selling at the same price quoted a month ago, and the scarcity is not being felt in any districts in Umatilla county. Eggs are quoted at 30 and 35 cents today, following the Thanksgiving rush. More country eggs are coming to town and the grocers predict a gradual reduction in the price, until just a short time before Christmas, when the increased demand will likely cause a raise of a few cents. Live markets are uneventful.

FRUITS. Bananas, 40c dozen. Apples, 75c @ \$1 box. Pears, \$1.00 box. Lemons, 40c doz. Oranges, 40-50c doz. Prunes, 3c lb. 50c box. Cranberries, 20c quart. Quinces, 5c per pound. Grapes, California \$1.3c pound.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY. The following prices are paid by dealers to the producer: Turkeys, 10 @ 12c. Chickens—Hens, 7c; \$3 @ 4 per dozen; roosters, 4 to 6 cents. Geese, per dozen, \$3. Ducks, per dozen, \$3.50 @ 4. Butter, 50 @ 55c, good. Eggs, 30c.

CHOICE BEEF CATTLE, ETC. Cows, per hundred, \$2.50; Steers, \$3.10-\$3.25. Hogs, live, \$4.85 @ 5. Hogs, dressed, 7 1/2c. Veal, dressed, 7c. Sheep, \$2 @ 2.50.

HAY AND FEED. Chop barley, \$2.50 per ton; 1 1/2c per lb. Chopped wheat, \$1.40 per 100. Bran, 60 cents per sack. Shorts, \$1 per sack. Oats, 1 1/2 cents per lb. Alfalfa, loose, \$12 per ton. Wheat, loose, per ton, \$12. Timothy, baled, per ton, \$20.

LOCAL HIDE MARKET. The following are the prevailing average prices for hides in this market: Beef, green, 4 @ 6c per lb.; beef, dry, 10 @ 13c; mink, 50 @ 80c each, with a possibility of \$1 each if the size is good and the condition prime; coyote, 75 @ 80; bear skins, according to quality and size, from \$3 to \$15; coon, 30 @ 35; horse, perfect, with head, tail and mane, \$1 @ 1.25; sheep, green, 6c; sheep, dry, 3 1/2c; skunk, 25c; badger, 15 @ 30c.
