One feature of the local market which is worth mentioning, is the ex-cellent supply of local potatoes on hand, in all the stores this fall. The acrease of potatoes raised this year in the vicinity of Pendleton will be sufficient to supply the city for the winter. Heretofore it has been neces-sary to ship in many tons from Walla Walla and North Yakima, but this will be obviated this winter. Inquiries from dealers in North Yakima already been received, but Pendleton merchants have invariably replied that there is nothing doing. The quality of the home-grown article is excellent this year, as little rain fell during the period of maturity, which left the potatoes dry and mealy, and better by far than any imported article ever handled here. They are retailing at 1 cent per pound, or 90
