PENDLETON RETAIL MARKETS

Quotations on Staples Furnished by Local Merchants and Revised Daily.

Apples are now scarcer than usual at this season of the year, and while the prices are still quoted as earlier in the fall, there is every reason to believe that there will be a raise before long. The quantity of the winter apples now in the market is fair. It is the belief of local grocers that greater quantities of fine fruit will be forthcoming whenever the market suits the growers. The holiday trade begins to be felt around the edges and by the first of next week extra force will be working in all the stores to handle the rush.

FIRST IDAHO SUGAR. New Refinery at Idaho Falls Turns Out First Product.

Boise, Dec. 7.—Sugar to the amount of 100,000 pounds has been turned out at the new sugar refinery at Idaho Falls and the factory is still grinding away at full capacity without a hitch. The sugar is now ready for shipment and in order to comply with the provisions of the sugar bounty law, which specifies that a bounty of 1 cent per pound will be paid by the state on sugar manufactured in 1903, the state board of examiners has arranged for the inspection of the output.

Secretary of State Will H. Gibson and Alex. McPherson, state pure food inspector, left yesterday for Idaho Falls. Mr. Gibson will see that the sugar is properly weighed and stamped and Mr. McPherson will test its quality. It is probable that a competent inspector will be appointed by the state board of examiners to look after the weighing and branding of sugar in Idaho factories. The amount of bounty to be paid the refinery on its initial output will be \$1,000. The bounty law provides that the state shall appropriate the sum sufficient to meet the requirements of the act.

SEARCH FOR THE BODIES. No Trace of the McFarland Boys Drowned in Snake River.

Lewiston, Dec. 7.—J. J. Brown arrived in the city last night from the upper Snake river, where he has been engaged in the search for the bodies of the McFarland brothers, who were drowned in Salmon river eddy last Friday. Mr. Brown commenced the search early last Sunday and has devoted his entire time since in searching for the bodies, but has been unable to locate the remains. The character of the river at the place where the drowning occurred is such that the bodies may not be recovered until they come to the surface and drift to the eddies below. For five miles the waters are very wild and a continual series of eddies and whirls and it is probable that the remains will be carried beneath the surface for a long distance unless caught by the rocks in the bottom of the river in which event it would be months before they come to the surface.
