Paid for Church in a Day.

With the opening of the new Central Christian church building on December 6, one of the largest church auditoriums in the state was formally opened for public worship. It seats fully 1,500. The services were conducted by Rev. James S. Myers of Fort Worth, Texas who announced that he had been brought here, in addition to conducting the opening exercises, with a view to raising \$12,000 towards defraying the church indebtedness. He succeeded in raising that sum almost to a dollar. The amounts pledged at the morning meeting alone were in excess of \$11,000. The rest was raised at night. The dedication service proper did not take place till after the evening sermon, at about 9:30 o'clock.—Spokesman-Review.

Quill Drivers Organize.

At a meeting held Monday afternoon in the Spokesman-Review offices, plans were made for the formation of a new press club, to consist of newspaper men employed on the editorial staffs of papers published in Spokane. The old press club has been defunct for about two years, and it is planned to start another organization on somewhat different lines.—Spokesman-Review.

A Trick of the Trade.

Nearly sixteen thousand acres of the pine timber on the eastern slope of the Cascade mountains between the Military and McKenzie wagon roads, was deeded to a Minnesota timber firm the other day by the state land board for \$1.25 an acre. How did they manage to get such a quantity when an

individual is allowed to purchase but 160 acres, and that at \$2.50 an acre? Simply by hiring some sixty persons to file on the land with the land scrip for which the state got but \$1.25 an acre. And at that time a person outside the state land ring could not get an acre of scrip from the state board at the state price. It was peddled about by their agents, whose profits may well be imagined.—Eugene Guard.

A suit has also been commenced in the United States court at Moscow against Warren Bullock to recover \$720 for timber alleged to have been illegally taken from the Bitter Root forest reserve.—Boise Capital News.

PLAN FOR ATLANTA

SCHEME TO CAPTURE TWO UNIVERSITIES

Want Two Presbyterian Seats of Learning Removed from Other Cities—Conference Now in Session Will Have Great Influence on the Issue.

Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 9.—Presbyterians throughout the South are awaiting with intense interest the outcome of the conference commenced in Atlanta today, which will go far toward settling the violent controversy over the proposed removal of the two centers of Presbyterian education in this section of the country.

The agitation was commenced more than a year ago, when Atlanta launched a scheme to capture two large universities, carry them away to Georgia and establish a vast institution of learning valued at nearly \$2,000,000, and which would rank with the greatest universities of the country.

The two universities in danger of removal are the Columbia Theological institute, located at Columbia, S. C., and the Southwestern Presbyterian university at Clarksville, Tenn. The first named university is under the control of the Presbyterian synods of South Carolina, Florida and Georgia, while the Clarksville institution is controlled by the synods of Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana.

Atlanta's Proposition.

Atlanta, which is a Presbyterian stronghold, proposed that the Southwestern Presbyterian university, valued at probably \$750,000, and the Columbia institution, valued at \$500,000, should unite and come to Atlanta, promising that the Presbyterians of this city and state should raise another half million dollars, thus starting a great institution worth nearly \$2,000,000.

The synods of Georgia, Florida and South Carolina controlling the Columbia university, endorsed the proposal, but a stumbling block was met with when the suggestion was made to the synods controlling the Southwestern Presbyterian university. The synod of Tennessee in particular is opposed to the removal of the university from Clarksville, though the attitude of the synods of Louisiana, Alabama and Mississippi is believed to be less hostile to the scheme.

The present conference is not decisive in character, but is intended merely to consider the feasibility of the plan, and then the ways and means. If the conference decides that the scheme is feasible and practical and that no moral or legal obstacles are in the way, then the respective synods will be asked to ratify the plan. This means that the fight will be prolonged and that there will be further heated agitation among Southern Presbyterians before a final settlement is reached.

State Association is One of the Strongest in the Country.

Cleveland, O., Dec. 5.—The Hotelkeepers' Association of Ohio, one of the strongest state organizations of hotel men in the country, began its annual meeting here today. Prominent hotel men from Cincinnati, Columbus, Springfield, Dayton, Youngstown and other cities are in attendance.

The bonifaces will spend two days discussing the advantages of close association and various questions of mutual interest. Between business sessions there will be abundant entertainment provided for the visitors by the hotel men of Cleveland.
