### FOUNG DEAD IN BED!

OLD GENTLEMAN DIES

SUDDENLY AT HURON.

Coroner Decides That No Inquest Is Necessary-His Companions Supposed the Deceased Was Asleep, When They Came Home From Work in the Evening.

When the meal had been prepared they called Mr. Hachesen, and as he did not respond, one of them went to the bed to awaken him, when it was found that he was dead.
