ous Winter Fields for Work-Many Reservoir Sites Surveyed and Extensive Reconnaisance Made,

The reclamation engineers have concluded their field work in this state for the year, and the men composing the forces that have operated under Engineer Ross have been scat-tered, some to other fields and others to office work for the winter in Mr Ross' office here, says the Boise Statesman. Civil service men have been assigned as follows: William G. Davies and Gilbert

William G. Davies and Gilbert Houge to work under E. T. Perkins on the investigation being made to determine the feasibility of the plan for turning the Colorado river out up on the great desert lying west of Yuma. Yuma

in Arizona. J. T. Burke, who has been in charge of the works at Minidoka; John L. Savage and Robert J. Newell to Mr. Ross' office here, where Charles B. Smith and Fred Stockton, the latb. Smith and Freu Stockton, the int-ter being hydrographer. have been employed. They will devote the win-ter to working up the results of their field operations, preparing sheets, others outputters of plats, estimates, etc. During the season a number of im-

portant projects have been given at-tention. One of these is the plan for reclaiming some 200,000 acres of very fine land in the section east of Dubols. That project involves utiliza-tion of all the storage facilities available along the North fork of the Snake. The work has been in charge of James G. Camp, who has been sent to Arizona for the winter. Fifteen hundred miles of reconnaissance cuveys were made and 500 miles of ac-tual trial lines run.

On the project at Minidoka a great amount of work was done. Four hurdred miles of trial lines were run. One bundred square miles of plane table was done, five-foot contours being chartered. Classification of 120. 000 acres of land was made and topo-graph surveys on a large scale wete made of the dam s te, also of the rock portions of the proposed canal, while 1.000 feet of boring was done with the diamond drill. On the Payette-Boise project 200

miles of trial lines were run out and all the data respecting the irrigation problem in the two valleys was compiled. The only surveying needed was in the section between the two rivers. all the remainder having been done over previously

During the year measurement of streams was widely extended, sta-tions being established on the head-waters of the Snake Reconnaissance surveys were made

on a great number of reservoir sites on the principal tributaries of the Snake. In addition, possible canal projects were looked over in many localities and vast amount of informa-tion gathered throughout the arid sec-tion of the state.
