The Oregon Daily Journal's market report for today says: Portland, Jan. 8.—As was exclusively predicted in the Journal yesterday, the feed market today showed some advances.

Wheat Market Strong. The wheat market is stronger on account of the sensational rise of prices in the Chicago market. Although the local millers are not making any extensive buys, those up the Willamette valley are making every endeavor to stock up by paying a healthy premium.

Flour Continues Healthy. The healthy tone of the flour market continues and the quotations are looking better, although no changes appear today. Local millers are now looking for a fair demand from the Orient and if war is declared they expect the market to boom.
